(as exams approach)

- Revision notes less detail and more scruffy!
- Use Revision Packs (if available), less Revision Guides at this stage.
- Use a PLC or Revision Checklist to systematically tick off each topic as you revise it
- Aim to revise each bit of knowledge at least 3 times before the exam.
- Put resources/revision notes in separate folders for different subjects
- Revision Room is now on EVERY DAY in the library til 4:45pm come along to get 1.5 hrs revision done before you even get home. Cookie, drink & sweets provided.
- Check your Lymm HS email I am sending through papers for core subjects all the time.

Uniform for exams

- Potential hot weather
- From 15th May onwards
- You may wear your <u>school uniform</u> OR your <u>Lymm HS PE kit</u> or a combination of the 2 on any day where you have an exam
- You may take your blazer and tie off for exams no need to ask
- Respect this freedom though, or lose it!
- If you don't have an exam, you must be in school uniform

Ask the invigilator if...

- You think you have been given the wrong:
 - Subject
 - Level of paper (ie GCSE)
 - Tier (higher or foundation)
- Your exam paper or insert is not clean (ie has any handwriting on it)
- You have forgotten any equipment or your ID card
- You are not sure what equipment you are allowed to use
- You have accidentally brought something you aren't allowed into the exam
- You run out of paper
- You need the toilet (make sure you go beforehand!)
- You have ANY other problem or question in the exam
