Parent Information Evening on Drugs

Thank you to all those who attended the information evening. Over 170 parents and carers came to the event, which certainly seems to underline what an important issue this is in our community at the moment. If you haven't already seen it, further information (including the presentation delivered on the night) can be accessed via the <u>safeguarding section of our website</u>. In response to specific questions left at the end of the evening, we will be uploading more information to the website within the next couple of weeks.

In the meantime, a couple of parents asked for a little more information on how the school currently deals with drugs within school and I hope the following answers those questions.

The first thing to say here is that we are currently reviewing all of our policies and procedures in relation to drugs - as I said on the evening, we don't mind admitting that we are all somewhat playing 'catch up' in the face of a rapidly changing situation in society. We are doing a lot of work to look at best practice in other schools across the country and are in the process of developing a more comprehensive drugs policy, which parents will obviously be able to access when it is ready.

Secondly, it is very important to keep all of this in perspective and reassure parents and carers that the presence of drugs within school itself is still extremely rare. As an indication of this, since I joined the school

nearly four years ago we have only had four instances where drugs have been found in school - and all of these have been at the lower end of the scale in comparison to the issues faced by most schools. Our main concern in addressing this issue so openly has always been the patterns of behaviour that are developing in the evenings and at weekends rather than in school itself. Nevertheless, we want to be more vigilant than ever in terms of monitoring what is happening and our precise approach to all of this as we go forwards is being considered very carefully. As a minimum, preventative measures will include more frequent visits from trained sniffer dogs and more frequent random searches of selected students.

Beyond that, the key point is that we take the presence of drugs in school exceptionally seriously. In terms of punishments, students should be in no doubt that any involvement in drugs puts their place in the school at risk and permanent exclusion is a distinct possibility - and almost certain in cases of supply. At the very least, students can expect to be issued with lengthy fixed term exclusions and subject to various conditions of readmission - such as consenting to regular, random searches, participation in a drugs education/support programme and giving plausible undertakings not to repeat the same mistakes again.

The police would almost certainly be involved as well, though they will typically leave schools to deal with the issue unless it is especially serious; they (and we) generally do not want to criminalise young people unless it is absolutely necessary.

At the same time, most people will understand that every case has to be taken individually and there are always unique circumstances and various mitigating or aggravating factors. For example, we would take into account: the age of the student; their prior behaviour record; their honesty in owning up to any mistakes and their willingness (or otherwise) to share information that might help us to keep other students safe; the amount and type of drug involved; the extent to which they have initiated any activity as opposed to potentially being pressured into something; and, above all, the likelihood of them being involved in any future incident.

We also provide support for students and their families in cases where they have admitted to having problems with drug use; for example, our in-house counsellors and work with Warrington Youth Service. We can also signpost families to a range of external services.

In addition to the above, we do already provide education on drugs and alcohol as part of our Life programme. The starting point in terms of message here is that taking drugs is illegal and dangerous and should always be avoided but, particularly for older children, also looks at harm reduction strategies. As mentioned elsewhere, we are reviewing all of this at the moment and want to improve what we do. For example, we feel more can be done to educate young people about the medium and long-term risks to physical and mental health that come from taking drugs.

I hope the above provides the kind of information people were looking for when they left questions in the box at the end of the information evening. If it is particularly urgent, then please get in touch; otherwise, if you do have further questions, I would encourage you to attend the next parent forum on **Wednesday 1st May**, where I will be on hand to answer them.
