


PURPOSE OF THIS EVENING



EHAVIOUR


Students to always act as polite and mature role models within the school, showing respect to others and school property and to wear the appropriate business dress.

EXPECTATIONS A - ATTENDANCE

8 hours per subject, per week of independent work – directed by the teacher and set via Show my Homework

Where students fail to meet the required standard they will be directed towards additional supervised study periods

100% effort in all lessons and towards all aspects of sixth form life



Our mantra (and the secret to our brilliant results)



Each student will work a 40 hour week

Here's the maths

3 subjects x 4 hrs per week = 12 hours of lesson time

3 subjects x 8 hrs of independent work (essentially 2 hrs work per 1 hr lesson) = 24 hours

4 hours of enrichment = 4 hours

12 + 24 + 4 = 40 hours (resulting in hard working and independent young people)


Work hard, play hard!



Managing your workload



- Homework will be set on Show My Homework helps with organisation
- 13 hrs per week of 'non-contact' time. At least 3 of these are supervised study and you will be required to study in S202 / Upper Hex – if you use this time wisely you will keep on top of things easily.
- How to study independently guide
- Paid work maximum of 8 hours per week, ideally only one day per week (weekend).
- Your studies must take priority.



Assessment calendar



- Throughout sixth form we will monitor your progress carefully.
- Each half term you will have designated sixth form assessment weeks which will involve you sitting tests in each of your subjects.
- Your subject teachers will be really clear with you what you need to do to prepare for these tests, but it is your responsibility to prepare for them fully.
- You will be shown a poster of all of the assessment weeks and important dates – please add these to your calendars, it is your responsibility to know what is coming up and when.





What happens next?

- Select between one and five choices one should be a firm choice and one an insurance. We recommend 40 UCAS points difference between each
- Student has now entered into an agreement with these universities. If they
 change their mind they will need to be released by the institutions
- They are entering into an agreement (grades permitting) with these universities so ensure that they are happy to attend either
- Ensure that they reply to all offers before the deadline date (failure to do so is an instant decline of an offer).
- UCAS Extra for late applicants and those who change their mind
- Results day
- Clearing / Adjustment



Predicted grades

- Always optimistic (taking everything into account and not just mock grades)
- We have to be realistic though
- Students will see their predicted grades very soon
- Students sign off their application before it is sent to UCAS
- Honest, transparent process



•Grades tell us about ability

•Statement tells us if they are going to finish

•Do they genuinely know what they're getting in to?

•Do they know what it is?

•What is their narrative?

•Do they understand the skills required and can they evidence them?
