Year 12: What will you do next?

Year 12 will be focusing on what options they may pursue after Sixth Form, researching ideas. The aim being to provide them with a focus for their studies and time to look at what is available before their applications begin in the summer term.

Year 13: Futures & Careers

Year 12 will spend the first half of the session in the Lower Hex altogether. The session will cover some areas surrounding futures linked to their applications. The session encompasses both UCAS & Apprenticeship timelines, selecting the right university or apprenticeship, finance, accommodation.
