Remote Teaching and Learning Update

Whilst none of us can be sure when students of different year groups are going to be back in school and things could obviously change at any point, it does seem safe to say remote teaching and learning is likely to be the primary method of provision for many of our students for at least the next few months.

For lots of reasons, we have not been in a position to provide too many 'live' online lessons until now. However, many teachers have been delivering them and our aim is to try to include more and more remotely taught content over the coming weeks. This will, in the first instance, sit alongside our other learning materials on Show My Homework, and the less formal content and competitions on social media.

Next Steps:

We are proposing that we run next week (18/5/2020) as a trial week where we offer some timetabled online lessons for all students in Y7, 8 and 9. We will be using Microsoft Teams, which many students are already using successfully for online lessons, though we recognise that this may not be the most appropriate platform for use in the long term. Again, our trialling will help us to find out what is working and what is not, so your patience and constructive feedback is absolutely appreciated! What Will This Look Like?

If your child is in Year 7, 8 or 9, they will be invited to attend <u>up to three online lessons each day</u>. Across the course of the week, there will be content from:

- English
- Maths
- Spanish
- German
- French
- Geography

- Science
- History
- Art
- Religion, Philosophy and Ethics
- Performing Arts

Other subjects will continue to offer content through Show My Homework, so please remind your child to keep checking their work there, too.

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When Will My Child Receive Their Online Lessons?

Students will be "invited" to attend a meeting by the teacher leading their taught session via Microsoft Teams, so should log in on Monday morning ready for their first class. The sessions are timetabled to coincide with our school day timetable's periods, so students should be signed into Teams and ready to work with writing materials/computer at the appropriate time:

Lesson 1: 8.45am Lesson 3: 11.15am Lesson 5: 2.10pm

Lesson 2: 9.45am Lesson 4: 12.15pm

Some classes will be split into tiers depending on their targets - a Platinum/Gold tier (A) and a Silver/Bronze tier (B). Your child will know which class they are to attend as they will be invited by the teacher, but they may see that other 'meetings' are timetabled at the same time.

The only exception to this is **English**. Your child will receive two invitations for English lessons; one will be pitched at students who are more confident (A), and the other for students who need a little more support (B). Your child should decide which level of challenge is most suitable for them, but can choose a different group for their subsequent lesson if the pitch wasn't quite right for them.



If your child is not invited to a lesson at this time, they should be working on materials set on Show My Homework in the same way that they have been since the school closure in March.

There may be instances where your child cannot access the lesson at the set time, and in this case, they can access it afterwards by clicking on the 'class materials' folder for that subject, and finding the recording for that session. While we endeavour to record all lessons, please bear in mind that this is a trial of running online lessons on a large scale, so there may well be lessons where recording was not possible for technology reasons. There will also be the facility for your child to ask questions in the taught lessons, which will not be possible if they access it at a later point in time.


Expectations

Time to check what you know! You might be asked to complete a quiz or an assessment. Work independently and make sure you submit any work that I need to check.





MICROPHONES OFF:

We ask you to switch your microphone off to help everybody to hear the lesson and concentrate fully LYMM If you switch your microphone on to ask a question, or I ask you to switch it on, please switch it off again immediately afterwards.





MICROPHONES ON:

In smaller groups, you may be asked to switch your microphone on for the class. Make sure that you are in a quiet space so you and your class can stay focused.
