We will be holding a proper opening ceremony in the autumn, but for now I just want to once again thank everyone who supported this project. It will be an absolutely fantastic facility for the whole community and we are very excited about it!

- We will be back in full **uniform** next year. Please see the notes at the end of this update for some reminders about particular elements of uniform policy; we do not want to waste any time battling with students in September who have chosen to turn up incorrectly dressed.
- Please remember that our policy for **mobile phones** is changing next year for students in years 7–11. If a child does bring an electronic device with them to school, it must be switched off and stored safely and securely in their school bag or else it will be confiscated. Please note that this includes **smart watches**.
- For those doing the Duke of Edinburgh, a reminder that the deadline for students to have uploaded all three Assessor Reports and completed their Physical, Skill and Volunteering sections on eDofE in order for them to receive the interim DofE Certificate of Achievement is the last day of term: Wednesday 22nd July. This certificate recognises participants' achievements in these 3 sections in light of the postponement of expeditions, which we are still hoping will take place once trips and visits are up and running again. We hope that participants will still choose to complete their expeditions when things resume and subsequently receive their full DofE Award certificate and badge in addition to this one.

Uniform reminders from Mr Thompson

- 1. All students must be in shoes, not trainers or trainer-style shoes. Shoes must be black, plain in style and polishable. Boots, pumps, canvas shoes or anything with a logo are not permitted.
- 2. All coats must be dark in colour. More than ever it will important to have a suitable coat for school next year. In order to keep everyone safe students will need to stay outside at both break and lunchtime as much as possible.
- 3. Hair should be neat and conventional with no extremes of style/colour. No haircuts shorter than a grade 2 are allowed. If a student wishes to have a different hairstyle during the holidays, please make sure they leave sufficient time for it to grow or return to natural colouring in time for the start of school.
- 4. No visible body piercings, irrespective of when the piercing was done. Students need to bear this in mind if they do choose to get any piercings over the holidays.
- 5. Make-up must be discreet, nails must be short and unadorned. No gel, extensions or jewels. Clear nail varnish only. Eyebrows and eyelashes should be natural, no fake eyelashes.
- 6. Plain black formal trousers that hold a crease. Jeans style, cords or canvas trousers are not acceptable and nor are exceptionally baggy or tight-fitting trousers.
