## YEAR 10 SUMMER CONSOLIDATION WORK

We have been incredibly impressed with our Year 10 students and how they have adapted so quickly to remote learning. Their engagement both online and in school has been excellent, along with their maturity and resilience in what has been a challenging time. We are also incredibly grateful for the support shown by parents throughout the period of closure and have been overwhelmed by encouraging messages.

To support Year 10 students with their preparations for September, we have ensured that all subject areas have put together Personalised Learning Checklists for students. These will outline the topics that have been covered remotely during school closure and will allow students to identify any topics or specific material that they feel they need to revisit to secure their knowledge for their return to school in September. This material will be available on Microsoft Teams in the specific subject teams and channels. Within each subject team, staff have made lesson PowerPoints and accompanying material available in topic folders so that students can consolidate prior knowledge, as well as going over any work that may have been missed. Lesson recordings are also available in subject teams.

I would like to stress that this work is not compulsory, but it is an opportunity for students to consolidate their remote learning topics as required.

For English and Maths, the work which will be available for Year 10 students will differ slightly from this model and will look like:

**Maths** - Students can pick 20 days during the 6-week holiday and complete "5 a day" questions in their books. These will be revisited by their Maths teachers in September. This equates to 100 quick questions.

**English** - Students will be provided with a series of research tasks based on topical issues introduced during the last half term.

Please see overleaf for an overview of all topics covered across subjects during school closure. This may be a useful point of reference, but remember that all specific checklists and material to support consolidation in these areas will be available via Microsoft Teams.

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I am really looking forward to working with Year 11 from September and feel confident that we are going to enjoy a successful year. We will be in touch early in September with details of our parental information and guidance event, which will be useful in outlining our expectations for Year 11, along with support that will be available for students throughout the year.
