Dear Parent/Carer

I hope you and your child have had an enjoyable summer despite the disruption caused by the current pandemic. I am writing to welcome you back to the start of a new academic year at Lymm High School and to give you some important information for the year ahead.

Our role as a school is to ensure that your child is safe and happy in school and to support them in achieving their academic and personal potential. I was absolutely thrilled by how much commitment, hard work and energy the students put into the last academic year before and during lockdown. I was really impressed with how quickly the students adapted to remote learning and as a result they're in a much stronger position as we return to school.

Year 9 is an extremely important year for your child. Later this year they will choose their GCSE options which will shape the education they receive in KS4 and beyond. Wearing the correct uniform, coming to school well equipped and behaving in an exemplary manner are expectations that we hold for all our young people and I make no apology in saying that the expectations we have are extremely high. I thank you for
