### **Face Coverings**

The government has made it clear that there is an expectation that all staff and students wear face coverings in lessons for the next few weeks, in addition to indoor communal areas. Please make sure your child brings a face covering into school. We would also be grateful if you could reinforce the message of social responsibility with them: i.e. wearing a face covering is at least as much about showing respect for, and protecting, the people around them as it is about protecting themselves. We will provide a card for students who have a medical reason for being exempt – please contact the relevant Head of Year if this is the case. Students will not need to wear face coverings outside the school building.

We know this isn't ideal but, as I've said before, it seems a small price to pay to help get all students back into school as soon as possible – and we don't anticipate it being for long.

## **Covid Testing**

Thank you for all your support with Covid testing over the last few days. The systems worked really well and everything went very smoothly, with very little waiting time for students. The turnout was incredible – well over 95% of students came in, along with nearly all staff, and we have administered over 2000 tests. This level of support and engagement reflects extremely well on you as parents and carers; thank you.

Remarkably, not one of these tests has come back positive and I think we can all take some comfort from that. However, at the same time, it is essential to stress that this does not mean we can relax in following other guidance. Lateral flow tests are not 100% accurate and, in any case, testing negative one day does not mean someone cannot contract the virus the next day. As ever, the best advice is that we all behave as if we might have the virus ourselves.

As mentioned in the guidance that went to parents on Tuesday, we will only get in touch with you directly if there has been a positive result and that would take place within just over 30 minutes of the test. Due to the

time taken to log all of the results onto the government website, there will be a delay before you get the text message. It may now be early next week by the time you get this. However, we can assure you that we will have notified you very quickly if there was a positive result so please do not worry if you haven't yet had a text message.

Year 10 and 11 students will have their second test in school on Monday. Students should just go to their lessons as normal on arrival and we will explain the arrangements for testing to them then. Other year groups will follow on Tuesday and Wednesday – again, instructions will be given to students in school.

### Plans for next week's re-opening

All students have received a guide to school re-opening on Monday. These are the key reminders from Mr Thompson:

- All students need to bring their own face covering and hand sanitiser to school each day. Face
  coverings should be worn at all times when inside the building, including during lessons. Students
  should sanitise their hands every time they change location.
- The school one-way and door entrance system is still in operation. Students need to enter/exit the
  school building via the exterior door closest to their classroom. Traveling through school along
  corridors is not permitted, and all no entry signs need to be observed. All movement should be via
  the outside of the school building.
- When students arrive at school they need to make their way directly to the entrance location for their period one lesson (noting that this will potentially be a different location each day). They should wait outside in this area, maintaining 1m distance from other students until 8.15am when they are allowed to enter the school building and make their way directly to their classroom.
- All students should carry their equipment in an appropriate school bag. The minimum expectation is that all students come to school properly equipped each day; the amount of equipment we can lend out will be limited.
- Year group bubbles at break and lunch time are still in place. Students should remain in their designated areas at these times.
- Mobile phones and smart watches must remain switched off during school hours and should be kept in bags from the moment students arrive on site in the morning until they leave the school buildings at the end of the day.
- All students should return in full school uniform.

# PE kit requirements

These are the arrangements for PE lessons until the Easter holidays.

- Girls Year 7–11 will require PE kit and trainers for netball
- Boys Year 7–10 will require PE kit and football boots (suitable for the 3G pitch) for tag rugby
- Boys Year 11 will require PE kit, shin pads and football boots (suitable for the 3G pitch) for football

### **Boys**

Due to Covid-19 restrictions, the boys had been using the sports hall as a changing room. However, because of the Covid testing taking place this is not available from Monday 8<sup>th</sup> March until Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> March. Therefore, next week boys are expected to come into school in their PE kit along with suitable footwear, such as trainers, for the days when they have their lessons. Their football boots should be packed in their bag. PE kit MUST be in line with school PE kit regulations.

As we are unable to use the changing rooms, students are expected to leave their bags in the school gym. This will be the same system that we used prior to Christmas when the Year 11 students were taking their mock exams in the sports hall. Unfortunately, if the weather is extremely wet, lessons may have to be adapted with groups going in classrooms for part of the lesson. This will prevent students being in wet clothes for the remainder of the day.

#### **Girls**

Girls will continue using the changing facilities during this time and will be required to arrive in their normal school uniform.

#### **Extra-curricular sport**

Extra-curricular sport will restart the week commencing 15<sup>th</sup> March, on the same days prior to lockdown. Further details regarding activities will be provided next week.
