Centurion Challenge accomplished!

Well done to Year 13 Charlie Ford and his rowing partner Quinlan Dunne who successfully rowed 100km last Sunday. The pair's endeavour, which took 8 hours and 32 minutes, raised over £5000 for the River Reeves Foundation, Child Bereavement UK and Warrington Youth Rowing.

Quinlan's older brother, River Reeves, died tragically in 2016 with his Viola Beach band mates. Following the tragedy, Quinlan and his siblings received support from Child Bereavement UK and he has been involved with the charity ever since, helping to raise awareness of how grief can affect the lives of young people.

The River Reeves Foundation aims to provide bursaries and support for disadvantaged young people looking to develop their futures within the performing and visual arts.

Quinlan and Charlie now want to double their total to £10,000. Coldplay have already made a generous donation!

- Students should ensure they complete an Open Day for any potential universities. These are taking place both face-to-face and online. All students should ensure they have added both their GCSE and A' Level qualifications to their UCAS applications.
- Please can students check their email and reply to Mrs Lowry-Johnson regarding their plans after Sixth Form and UCAS referees. Those who have not completed the online form before summer have been emailed directly by Mrs Lowry-Johnson.
