What are they and why does Lymm High 6th Form offer this?

Enrichment electives offer a variety of activities for Lymm High students to be involved in in addition to their subject studies. These enrichment electives will help develop personal skills and confidence which are integral to life outside of school.

Likewise they offer the opportunity to develop the core competencies looked for by employers and universities who encourage students to include specific details about their extracurricular involvement in applications.

What skills will enrichment electives help me develop?

Independence, communication skills, working with others through teamwork, resilience, flexibility and work life balance, leadership, analysis, presentation skills (depending on the club).

How does it work?

At Lymm High we would like students to get involved in different activities across the year. Students will be encouraged to sign up to enrichment electives worth 5 credits each. They should aim to complete 5 credits each half term to total 30 across the school year (for Year 12) or 25 for Year 13. If students wish to do more than this then they are more than able to do so, timetable permitting.

Here is a list of all the different activities we plan to offer across the year each worth 5 credits. If you would like to run an additional club we do encourage this; please let us know and we can help you set it up. Extended Project Qualification

An opportunity for students to extend their abilities beyond the A Level syllabus, stand out and prepare for university or their future career. It can also be used to earn extra UCAS points. For Year 13 students only must commit to a full year.



The Gateway Programme

Students who are interested in studying at Oxbridge or for medicine should be part of this programme, which supports our most able students to achieve their goals.



STEP Mathematics

This course will prepare students for the STEP (Sixth Term Examination Paper) which is designed to test candidates on questions that are similar in style to undergraduate mathematics. STEP is used by the University of Cambridge as their basis for conditional offers.

Duke of Edinburgh

An internationally recognised qualification that involves students developing physical, practical and social skills via completing an expedition and ongoing tasks. Students have the opportunity to complete their Gold Award.

LEADERSHIP Opportunities



Prefect
