### **Covid testing**

A reminder that students need to take a lateral flow test on **Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> January** before returning to school.

In addition to this, we have been asked by the Government to test all students once on return to school. This means that Years 7 to 11 will return to school on **Tuesday 4**<sup>th</sup> **January** and testing will take place during normal lesson times throughout the day. Years 12 and 13 will receive remote lessons on Tuesday 4th and will return to school on **Wednesday 5**<sup>th</sup> **January**, with testing taking place during form time and Period one.

Please note that if your child has tested positive within 90 days prior to this testing then it is advised that they do not undertake these lateral flow tests. However, if they develop symptoms you should arrange for a PCR test.

#### **Covid vaccines**

The school-aged immunisation team will be coming back to school on the **10**<sup>th</sup> **and 11**<sup>th</sup> **January** to offer eligible children their second dose of the Covid vaccine (children that have had their first dose at least 12 weeks previously).
