The <u>Sutton Trust US Programme</u> helps state school students in the UK to explore higher education and US culture. The programme includes UK-based residentials before all students get to visit US universities in the summer of 2022. An optional part 2 of the programme supports students to apply to US universities alongside their UCAS options. The programme is free to take part in: all costs are covered for students including travel, accommodation, food and admissions test preparation.

To be eligible, students must:

- Be in Year 12
- Attend, and have always attended, a state-funded school or college
- Not hold US citizenship
- Be from a low- or middle-income family (a household earning £45,000 or less)
- Be interested in US culture and higher education

Students must submit their application by midnight on **16th January 2022** to be considered for the programme. However, we encourage getting started as soon as possible as the application form requires some thinking!




