Jubilee Bank Holiday

Because the Bank Holiday for the Queen's Jubilee falls in half-term, the government have said schools should have an additional bank holiday in term-time, at a point in the year of our choosing. Mindful of the amount of disruption students have already had over the past couple of years, we have decided to take this on what would have been the last day of the school year – i.e. **Friday 22nd July**. This means that the last day of term this year will now be **Thursday 21st July**.

Covid latest and 'Window into Lessons' for students isolating

As you would expect, numbers of Covid cases are still fairly high (albeit nowhere near as high as at times last year) and this includes amongst staff. We have been able to manage this pretty well so far and, especially with the latest reduction in the time for self-isolation announced by the government, feel confident we'll continue to be able to do so. However, it can present real challenges at times and we are grateful for people's continued understanding of the fact that certain things continue to be less than ideal.

For students who are well, but need to isolate at home due to Covid, we continue to offer our 'Window into Lessons'. If children are well enough to take part in online lessons, they should be logged into Teams so that they can join the lesson once started by the teacher. Please bear in mind that this may be a few minutes later than ordinary lesson times, to allow for staff movement and the settling of students in the classroom. These online lessons are provided for the vast majority of lessons, but in some cases of staff absence, or practical subjects for which the online format is not suitable, they will not necessarily always take place – again, thank you so much for your patience and understanding in these kinds of situations.

As you may be aware, there are changes to the self-isolation period for those who test positive for Covid from **Monday 17th January.** From this date, people who are self-isolating with Covid will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow test (LFT) on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if students test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to school immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be reported to NHS Test and Trace.

If the result of either of their tests is positive, students should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFTs on consecutive days, or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest. Anyone who is unable to take LFTs or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10-day period of self-isolation.
