If a student is going to be absent from school, for any reason, we **must** have confirmation from a parent on **each day of the absence** please.

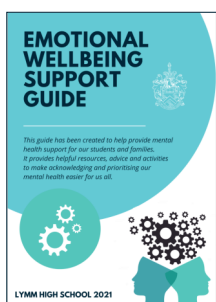

A taste of success – Work experience

HSBC is offering several Work Experience placements in 2022.

The Work Experience programme at HSBC UK offers a 5-day shadowing experience to students in the later years of full-time secondary education, Sixth Form or college. The programme has been set up to help young people from different social-economic backgrounds to gain an insight into a professional environment, as well as the banking industry.

In total, there are over 200 Work Experience opportunities nationwide, all of which will be available for one week with a mix of hybrid working (1 day in the office and four days virtually).

Dates:

- Week commencing **20th June 2022**
- Week commencing **4th July 2022**
- Week commencing **1st August 2022**

The placements are spread out across the UK and students can list their location preferences when applying (subject to availability).

The closing date for applications is **16th February 2022**, however these places are offered on a rolling basis and some adverts may be closed early if spaces are filled. Places are limited so we recommend students apply as early as possible to avoid disappointment.

Free In2scienceUK 2022 Summer Programme



Applications are now open for the 2022 In2scienceUK Summer Programme for Year 12 students.

The programme is completely free and connects students to experts from all areas of STEM through in-person work experience alongside virtual workshops. The focus is on providing students with the guidance they need to confidently choose a career pathway and produce high quality UCAS and apprenticeship applications.

By securing a place on the In2scienceUK summer programme, students will gain access to:

- 1- to 2-week in-person work experience and mentoring: Students spend each day at their mentor's workplace where they'll gain insight on working in their chosen STEM sector. Students also receive tailored advice for their own needs and professional aims.
- Online skills, employability and careers workshops: Produced by top researchers from across the UK, students gain specialist knowledge and skills in topics not covered in school. These workshops provide practical support to kickstart their career journey delivered through online webinars hosted by experts in various fields.
- Alumni Network: After the programme, students will be connected to an extensive Alumni Network which provides free workshops, informational career sessions, and networking opportunities with other young people who have gone through the In2scienceUK Programme. The Alumni network extends to roughly 3000 people spanning over 10 years of In2scienceUK Cohorts.
