Dear parents and carers

It's been a funny week for me because I have succumbed to Covid and have been at home since Monday afternoon. Although the virus itself certainly hasn't been very pleasant, far worse has been the frustration at being forced to miss out on so much that has been going on. I had been desperately looking forward to seeing the school production roll into action again and, from all the many accounts I've had, I wouldn't have been disappointed; everyone is telling me that *Grease* has been a fabulous show and that the students and staff have excelled themselves. Congratulations to everyone involved and best of luck for the last show tonight.

I have also managed to miss out on watching the Year 8 girls football team win the Cheshire Cup on Wednesday – another event that was firmly in my diary and promised to be a highlight even without knowing that we were going to win in such dramatic fashion. On top of all that, the Year 9 girls won their semi-final yesterday, which at least means I can look forward to watching their final soon after Easter. Very well done to all the girls in both teams, and indeed to Mrs Slater; it's fantastic to see girls football going from strength to strength. All in all, with these and all the other positive events going on in school this week (I do hope many of you took note of World Down Syndrome Day on Monday, for example) it feels like I couldn't have picked a worse week to be self-isolating!

You will all be aware that Covid rates are high again and we've certainly seen that in school over the past few weeks. It doesn't seem to have impacted students quite as much in terms of absence (at the time of writing, only 22 students out of over 1950 are off with the virus) but staff absence is still stubbornly high (we have 11 colleagues off with Covid today, for example). Of course, this means we still have significantly more lessons requiring cover than usual and the way these things work is that the impact is not even – so some students will inevitably have a lot more cover lessons than others at any one time. At the same time, teachers are more often than not able to 'Zoom in' from home to deliver the content which, although clearly not ideal, is a lot better than any other option and generally actually works remarkably well in practice. Equally, the five-day isolation period means that staff are usually not off for long now and the disruption to most classes is relatively brief. Either way, thank you once again for all your patience and understanding on this.

Finally, thank you to everyone who has contributed items for our appeal to support Ukrainian refugees; we had an incredible response and will continue to do what we can to support those families, including any that find their way to our part of the world. Some of you may have seen that we've been flying the Ukrainian flag outside school this week to demonstrate our solidarity with them. It certainly puts into perspective the challenges we've faced as a school this year.
