




What will work be like in the future?






Parents' Guide to Careers Week

Spotlight on 'Green' jobs Wednesday 9th and Thursday 10th March



As climate change and environmental concerns top the social, political and youth agenda, green jobs are the focus of the fourth series of <u>Spotlight Talks</u>, in partnership with NCFE.

The government's ambition to create 2 million jobs in the green economy by 2030 is an exciting opportunity for young people to develop skills that will help accelerate the UK towards net-zero.

In this 2-day online event, students will hear from young people undertaking green technical training or apprenticeships, and top employers will outline the growing range of opportunities on offer.

Taking place during National Careers Week, sessions are broken down into 30-minute slots to fit into school timetables and contain live Q&As, videos and expert career advice. Examples of the topics explored include:

- The switch to electric vehicles and how it will revolutionise the skills needed in the automotive industry
- New methods of designing and building houses to be more energy efficient is opening up new routes into the construction industry
- How STEM skills are fundamental to addressing the challenges of climate change


