CV Writing



During form this week, Year 12 will be focusing on their CV writing skills. When writing a CV, students should follow this format:

- Aim for all text to fit on one page
- Work in bulletpoints rather than long paragraphs
- Use 'doing' words to highlight what skills were gained
 - (e.g. **analysed** data for an IT firm or **managed** customer enquiries)
- Order CVs by date order or skill
 (e.g leadership roles vs. teamwork roles)






