Dear Parent/Carer

Re: Yr13 Leavers' Prom and Last day

I am writing to confirm arrangements for all Year 13 students as they near the end of their studies and their time at Lymm High School. I know many of our students are now ready to take that next step and as sad as that may make us, we really are looking forward to giving them the send-off they deserve! I am therefore delighted to confirm that students will have their last formal day on Friday 20th May, after which they will begin their study leave. The day will include a time to sign shirts, say goodbye to staff and a final celebration assembly. Students will leave the school premises by 12:15pm.

Our Prom will be held on Wednesday 13th July at Statham Lodge and this will allow our students to say their final goodbyes. Tickets are £45, payable now on ParentPay, please note that students currently eligible for the bursary will have their ticket paid for, please see Mrs Hughes on student services to arrange this. If students do plan to attend, it is crucial they pay for their ticket by Monday 16th May to ensure correct numbers are secured with the hotel. The Prom starts at 7.00pm and finishes at 11.00pm and the price includes a welcome drink, a three-course meal and a disco in a beautiful private function room with its own bar and garden. If your son/daughter wishes to attend this fantastic event, please see the attached medical consent form and the permission slip and return them to Sixth Form Student Services by Monday 16th May. I know that students will consider this a little excessive, as they are old enough to do as they please now, but as this is a school event, I am sure you appreciate its necessity and I thank you in advance for your support with this.

External examinations are almost upon us, if you wish to see an overview of the dates of these you can find these here. Students will be issued with their individual timetables in due course, it is essential they check these carefully, taking note of their seat number, exam venue and the start time. I know many parents find it useful to also have these displayed at home somewhere visible too.

This year, exams are organised so that there is a minimum of ten days between the first and last exam in any subject. This will reduce the chance of students missing all exams in one subject, should they contract the Covid virus during the exam period. The government guidance suggests the following –

- Parents should, where possible, encourage their children to attend their exams. There
 may be exceptional cases though where this is not possible e.g. a temporary illness on the
 day of the examination.
- Will I need to provide proof of a positive Covid test if I fail to sit an exam due to Covid? There is no requirement for students to complete a Covid-19 test as evidence of your absence from an exam. In this instance, parents will be asked to complete a form to submit to the awarding bodies to verify these circumstances, and an application for special consideration will be made by the school.



- If a student has a high temperature on the day of their exam, they should stay at home and avoid contact with others, until they no longer have a high temperature and are well enough to attend. Students will be asked to self-certify and an application for special consideration made by the school. As the exams have been spaced out by at least ten days, you will be able to receive A-level grades based on the other components completed.
- If you do test positive for Covid, you should stay at home and avoid contact with others for 3 days (if 18 and under) or 5 days (if 19 or older) after the day you took the test. You will be asked to self-certify the reason for your absence and although you are not required to provide proof of a test, you could keep a record of the test, such as a photograph, as evidence if it is available. The school will then make an application for special consideration.

You can read more about the Government guidance <u>here</u> to reduce the chance of students missing all exams in a subject due to a Covid related illness.

The final weeks, days and lessons in the run up to the examination period will be focussed on revision, it is therefore essential students continue to attend lessons until their study leave begins. Students will no doubt start to feel a little more pressure this half term and we are particularly mindful of this, especially as they have not experienced an external exam period before. Students are well supported in school, subject staff, form tutors and the Sixth Form team are always on hand to support should they need it. If you are in any way concerned about your child, please do not hesitate to get in touch.

We have been delighted with how hard students have worked in the build up to their examinations and we really do appreciate your support with this. I know they have felt we have nagged them and I'm sure you have too, I promise they will thank you in the summer!

We are incredibly proud of each and every one of our students and we wish them all the very best for the future.
