

#### 2022 GCSE RESULTS AT LYMM HIGH SCHOOL

- 96% of Year 11s with 100% attendance to school achieved 5 or more GCSEs at grades
   9-4 including English & Maths
- Only 45% of Year 11s with less than 80% attendance achieved the same measure.

"Five 9-4 grades at GCSE inc. English Language and Maths remains the most common entry requirement for Sixth Forms, Colleges and apprenticeships, with many employers also asking for students to have achieved this measure."

By missing lessons as a result of low attendance, a student will:				
$\rightarrow$	Miss being taught new subject knowledge			
<b>→</b>	Miss recapping subject knowledge to make sure they 'get it'			
<b>→</b>	Miss key tests and assessments to test what they do and don't know			
<b>→</b>	Start to fall behind their peers and reduce their chances of achieving well in their GCSEs			
→	Struggle to make the transition between years because they won't have secured all subject knowledge from the year before			

"Good attendance starts early – a student with excellent attendance from Year 7 onwards will make faster progress and achieve better exam results by the time they finish Year 11, compared with a student who has poor attendance (90% or less). Students with 90% attendance every year of their school career, will have lost over 1,000 hours between Year 1 and Year 11."



### **Punctuality**

- Students should arrive at school by 8.15 am at the latest as form time begins at 8.25am
- Students must endeavour to be on time for all lessons, specifically form where registration will be taken.
- If students arrive late, they must sign in at student services.

### What Pupils/Parents need to know

#### Signing in – (Pupils)

- If you arrive to school after registration or return from an appointment you must sign in, <u>in Student Services</u>
- Pupils sign in on the new TV screen in Student Services
- Click Sign in on the screen
- Search for your form and then your name
- You will automatically be signed into school.

#### Signing out – (Parents)

- If you are leaving school during for the school day e.g. an appointment you must sign out, in the main reception
- You can only be signed out by a parent or carer
- Your parent or carer will use the TV screen in the reception area to sign you out
- Click sign out on the screen
- Search for your form and then your name
- You will automatically be signed out of school

If you are unsure what to do, please ask the Reception and Student Services team for help!

### Life Programme

#### **Delivery**

Each week, tutors will deliver life programme sessions to their form groups. On extended life programme days (see school calendar) these sessions are planned as a 45 minute session, linked to the RSHE and PSHE curriculum. This work is planned by Mr Dobson and Miss Dixon,

#### **Support**

Students will work in booklets that are created by the life programme team, and stored in the students orange folders that were shared last year. Any student without a folder should speak to their Form Tutor

#### **Assessment**

Assessment points are built into each term to assess learning and this information will be used to inform future planning. All key assessments will take place online as a form document, and will be analysed by the life programme team.

From this year we will be reporting on Life programme to parents. This will be an attitude to learning grade, and the expectation to highlight any concerns as normal. There will be monitoring of completion of classwork and engagement.

### **Progress Reports**

Your child will receive three progress reports a year and we will also send home % scores on their January and June exams:

- November PR1
- **February** PR2
- **July** PR3
- A letter will be sent home with each of the reports to explain the information on them.
- Contact your child's **subject teacher** if you have any questions.





### **Pupil Premium**

- Pupil Premium is Government funding schools receive to raise the academic attainment of certain groups of students. These are students who are:
  - Currently receiving Free School Meals (click <u>here</u> for application form and eligibility criteria);
  - Have previously received FSM in the last 6 years;
  - Currently in Local Authority care ('Looked After Child')
  - Adopted child (previously in Local Authority care, even if for 1 day)
  - Under a 'Special Guardianship Order' or 'Child Arrangements Order' (having left Local Authority care);
  - Have a parent currently serving in the UK **Armed Forces** or whose parent is in receipt of an Armed Forces pension (or have in the last 6 years).

If your child falls into any of these categories or your circumstances have changed, please TELL US! Any school funding is invaluable and this will be used to directly support your child in a number of ways. We will treat information in absolute confidence.



### **Pupil Premium**

#### **How is Pupil Premium funding used?**

- 1) To provide academic support for PP students
  - KS3 Upgrade Maths & English programmes
  - Academic staffing
  - Tutoring for PP students
  - Chromebooks to support home/remote learning
  - Online revision tools such as GCSE Pod and Tassomai Science
  - KS4 revision guides
- 2) To support student's attendance and mental health
  - Additional pastoral support
  - Flexible Learning Programme
  - Attendance intervention
- 3) Extra-curricular, trips and other support
  - Trips and visits
  - Peripatetic music lessons
  - School uniform











### Behaviour for Learning (BfL) Grades

- **BfL 1** A student has gone over and above what is expected i.e. outstanding
- BfL 2 A student has done what is expected of them i.e. good
- **BfL 3** A student has not quite got it right. E.g. talking after been told to work in silence, forgotten their homework /equipment or perhaps being a bit 'giddy'
- BfL 4 A student has had to be removed from the lesson for disrupting others' learning or not heeding earlier warnings or has not turned up to a teacher detention or has been rude or uncooperative with a member of staff
- BfL 5 A student has refused to leave a lesson when asked or other more serious (and rare) misbehaviour











### Why do students get detentions?

- **BfL 3** 10 minute teacher detention
- **BfL 4** 40 minute detention (lunch time)
- **BfL 5** Isolation (p1-5 in our isolation room) or an internal exclusion (8am 4pm) or fixed term external exclusion. If this is ever the case, we will let you know, and parents will be invited in on the morning of a potential internal exclusion.
- Uniform (known by students as a 'standards') 30 minute lunch time detention.

(Jewellery, skirt rolling and shirts untucked are an issue currently. Your support with this would be really appreciated)

- Failure to attend 10 minute teacher detention 40 minute lunch detention
- Failure to attend a lunch time detention after school detention until 4pm.
- Persistent lack of homework / equipment / PE Kit after school detention until 4pm.
- Failure to attend an after school detention extended after school detention (3:10-4:30pm)

## Knowledge Organisers How can you support your child's learning?


- Self-quizzing: look, cover, write, check

#### Who do I contact regarding homework?




