ast Wednesday, Year 9 braved the snowy conditions to visit the University of Manchester to hear a lecture presented by Professor Danielle George a BBC Science presenter and Vice Dean at Manchester University.


Her talk was entitled "The Robots are Coming" and she explained how robots can now carry out everyday tasks with ease. She demonstrated how a robot could solve a Rubik's Cube (in a fraction of the time of a human) and she set up a full robotic orchestra with the help of two of our students who volunteered and half a dozen others from the audience!

BAE SYSTEMS ROADSHOW



It's a numbers GAME! - BAE Systems STEM Roadshow engages Lymm High School maths students.

B ack in February, BAE Systems launched their new roadshow for 2018. The audience of Year 8 students enjoyed an afternoon of Maths activities, which included interacting with a robot courtesy of BAE Systems, the RAF and Royal Navy.

Alongside The Royal Academy's #ThisIsEngineering campaign, the roadshow, now in its thirteenth year, aims to inspire and instil excitement among school pupils around STEM, in the largest ever schools programme of its kind. With the focus on maths, students experienced a series of workshops and demonstrations to showcase various applications of the subject, from robotics and coding through to the use of maths in iPhone technology and even magic. During the interactive show, students volunteered to help solve a number of problems, including magic tricks, planning the allocation of aircraft on an aircraft carrier and much more.

Students were also lucky enough to see the propeller used to set the world record for the highest flight without an aircraft.

Engaging in practical activities based around the theme 'It's a Numbers Game,' students showed great enthusiasm whilst gaining an understanding on how the maths they are currently studying is the same maths used in a large number of high profile professions.

The students also met MIA the robot, a 70cm high android robot that showed just how advanced robotics can be.

This talking, dancing, sensing, 'thinking' robot has features that are present in many of the products that BAE Systems manufacture. For example, the gyroscope in the robot is very similar to the gyroscope that can be found in fast jets to help them keep level, or the ships that they build to keep them stable in rough seas.


Students also explored the uses of Virtual Reality and

developments in Facial Recognition Technology.

The session was light hearted and interactive and gave students a unique opportunity to see their school subject in a very different light!

SCHOOL NEWS

BERLIN 2018



Lymm High School students recently enjoyed a short study tour to the historic city of Berlin during the half term break.

ur 4th annual trip to the German capital, students had the opportunity to immerse themselves in German culture and history!

After a delayed start at Manchester Airport Year 11 students arrived at Schonefeld Airport around lunchtime.

A historical walking tour of Berlin gave our cohort a fun opportunity to explore this vibrant city, learn fascinating historical facts and visit many famous monuments. The tour involved visiting some of the most visited attractions in Berlin including the Brandenburg Gate, Museum Island, the Jewish Memorial and Hitler's bunker (now covered by a very grey carpark!)

All of these sites link to our History GCSE studies where students investigate the Weimar Republic and then the Rise of the Nazis followed by the Cold War including the construction of the Berlin Wall.

With a packed itinerary, students had an early start (well early for teenagers...a lie in for the staff with breakfast at 8am) to travel for a rather sombre visit to Sachsenhausen Concentration Camp. Unlike Auschwitz this was a labour camp mainly for political prisoners and those classed as 'asocial'.

During the visit students also learnt about the Soviet prisoners of war who were kept here during World War Two and the Nazi policy against them.

We were then dropped back into central Berlin to Checkpoint Charlie where students could appreciate how Berlin was divided from 1961.

In the afternoon, students explored the Topography of Terror Museum that is built in the grounds of where the Gestapo Headquarters used to be. The tour highlighted how ordinary many of the perpetrators of Nazi violence and policy were.

There was a photograph that was particularly poignant; Gestapo officers celebrating Fathers' Day by wearing silly hats, drinking beer and joking. This showed students the normality of many of the men, often at odds with perceptions of Nazi officers.

Students ended the day with a visit to the TV Tower, taking a moment to enjoy the 360 views of Berlin the building offers. The building was a great triumph of Stalin's during the Cold War, designed to show the power and status of Communist Europe.

Other cultural and historical highlights of the trip included poignant visits to the Reichstag (the German Parliament) to see the centre of German democracy and the Story of Berlin Museum.

Tour organiser Mrs Douglas concluded, "The Year 11 students were a pleasure to take on this trip and showed impressive knowledge and engagement in the two themes of the trip. The purpose of the trip was to bring to life the GCSE History course."



THESE BRIDGES

On Tuesday 27th and Wednesday 28th February we performed this year's ambitious National Connections play, "These Bridges" by Phoebe Éclair-Powell.

Following the hugely successful production of "The Snow Dragons," last year, "These Bridges" follows four sets of teenagers who, when the Thames bursts its banks, submerges London and the north and the south of the city become separated, ignore the risks of the treacherous crossing to find out whether life on the other side is all it's cracked up to be.

It was an extremely challenging play to work with not least because it is entirely set on and under the water of the river Thames! I chose this particular play not just because of the challenging aspect but also that it was a huge ensemble production.

It has been such a pleasure to be able to work with this cast – 30 talented students from Years 9 – 12, all of whom became an integral part of the whole production. The cast took on the challenge brilliantly, becoming the sea of drowned commuters and brave teenagers with confidence, not only having to remember their lines, but also the constant movement, lifts and manoeuvring the number of milk crates around the stage! The feedback we received from our audiences was fantastic, recognising the incredible focus and commitment of each and every performer.

Our National Theatre director, who was in the audience on Tuesday evening, also recognised how focused and committed the cast were, and how they



had successfully managed to transport the audience from the School hall in Lymm, to the water of the Thames with ease. I am extremely proud of what our students created and when I think that we have only been working on it for 7 weeks, it just highlights how talented our students are.



Our next step is that we are taking These Bridges to The Crucible Theatre in Sheffield on the 22nd March, which we are very excited about.

We are lucky to be able to work with all the professional teams there and the cast will perform

in the professional theatre, which is the pinnacle of the Connections Festival itself.
