THE LEADERSHIP LADDER

One of the core aspects of our ethos at Lymm High School is the value we place on young people taking a full part in extra-curricular activities and, in particular, developing their skills and confidence in leadership. Year 7 students, Gracie and Layla talk about their first year experience of the Leadership Ladder and why students should embrace it...

In Lymm High School, the 'Leadership Ladder' can provide you with a lot of opportunities. Many prizes can be won, such as the upcoming Alton Towers trip. Students rush to get their planners signed by teachers to earn enough hall points to go on the latest trip.

The Leadership Ladder has stages – If you are in Year 7 and Year 8 you can earn lower bronze, silver and gold leadership colours, completing at least five activities to earn rewards and hall points. Year 9, 10 and 11 students work towards Upper Bronze, Upper Silver and Upper Gold Leadership Colours.

This may seem like a chore, but undertaking the activities on each step of the ladder can really help boost students' confidence and skills. In addition to this, you also have a much higher chance of grabbing enough hall points to enable you to enjoy the many trips and rewards on offer at school.

When you achieve bronze, silver or gold you earn a generous amount of hall points. Completing these activities help students learn how to be responsible and learn leadership

skills, but the opportunity to win hall points at each stage really encourages you to reach that goal.

We'd encourage all students to get on the leadership ladder and get involved. We have now earned another reward for completing this article for the school's newsletter!

INTER-COUNTY CHAMPION



Student celebrates success at Cheshire Schools' AA Track and Field and Mason Trophy Inter County Championships!

Lymm High School athlete, Jordan Jones travelled to Birmingham on Saturday 16th June, to compete in the Mason Trophy Inter Counties Schools Championships.

Representing Cheshire, the young athlete had qualified

through the Cheshire Schools Track and Field

Championships earlier this month, completing a solo run in the 1500m steeplechase.

During the race he smashed his personal best, knocking eight seconds off, to finish in 4.33 minutes to be crowned

Cheshire Champion.

The fast time placed Jones 4th in UK's U17's rankings, as well as inside the English Schools qualifying time, earning him the right to represent his county at the prestigious Birmingham stadium.

Other Lymm High School athletes who competed in the Cheshire Schools' AA Track and Field championships included Jasmine Jones, 8WL, in the Junior Girls 800m and Eva Ferris, 8DH, in the Junior Girls 1500m.

The Mason Trophy Inter Counties Schools' Championships at Birmingham saw Jordan Jones's summer continue to get better.

Running in the Inter Boys 1500m steeplechase, Jordan pulled away on the first lap and raced to 1st place winning Gold!

Absolutely tremendous! - that's some achievement and there's surely more to come.

Jordan now looks forward to representing Cheshire in the English Schools Athletics Association (ESAA) Track and Field Championships in July.

NATIONAL SCHOOLS REGATTA

A bronze medal for Lymm student Rowers as Warrington Rowing club juniors enjoy a weekend at the National Schools Regatta at Eton.

Lymm High School students had a successful three days racing at this year's National school's regatta which brings together all the top Junior crews in the UK.

Competing as part of Warrington Rowing club, a number of students visited Eton's Lake Dorney, the venue for the London rowing events with some great results.

Students Sam Preston and Ben Exley scooped a Bronze medal along with their team in the boys J14 race.

All the races were run over the Olympic distance of 2000m, meaning the juniors got some valuable experience of full-distance racing.

Other students who represented Lymm as part of the rowing club included Matt Baguely, with the J18 Quad coming 5th in the final and Ella Stanhope coming 2nd in the G1x B final, placing 10th with fellow student Cam Nyland overall.

Student Joe Baguley also competed with the Rowing club' J16 quad, finishing in at 11th place overall, whilst Martha Farrow with Matt Smith as cox came in at 13th.

Huge congratulations to all students who took part! As one of the toughest rowing events of the year they came out with superb results and made Warrington and Lymm High School proud!





A REMARKABLE RUN!



Lymm High School's Year 10 football team celebrate their third league title in a row!

Lymm High School's Year 10 football team made history this year, securing their third Warrington Schools League title in a row.

What's more, they have not been beaten by any of their neighbouring Warrington schools in just over two years – and they still have one year left of playing together.

However, Mr Gareth Powell, the team's coach, has urged his players to keep on achieving and has laid down a challenge for them – “why stop now?”

When asked about their success Mr Powell said, “I am massively proud of them. To achieve what they have done is some feat. To not be beaten by any Warrington school in two

years and four months is incredible.

“As I said to the players, though, why stop now? They have one year left together so the challenge is now set for them.

“It's been pretty much the same group of lads throughout the whole run, give or take one or two. They have become a really close group during that time, as well.

“What we're finding now is that we're getting big numbers at training sessions because students want to be part of our success, which is great.”

The success of the football team continues a great history of sporting achievement for current and former students of Lymm High School.

Notable former students include England rower Lucy Glover and runner Harriet Knowles Jones

Mr Powell said, “We've shown we can produce Olympic rowers and star runners.”

Usually known for rugby union prowess, he hopes his team's success has put football on the map at school. “When I came into this school, Lymm was always just thought of as a rugby school.

“The year 10 team has shown now that they are starting to turn heads, both inside and outside of school.
