Fifteen Y8 students have successfully completed the initial 'Brilliant Schools Brighter Futures' training as part of the 'Future in Mind' Project 2017/18.

T he training has been taking place across Warrington schools with the objective of equipping young people with the knowledge and skills that enable them to take charge of their own wellbeing. The aim is to share some of the 'secrets' of Positive Psychology, focusing on learning new habits of thinking and behaviour that will sustain personal 'brilliance'.

Our 'brilliant' Ambassadors are now busy designing their own wellbeing programme that they will deliver across their school and community.

The project runs throughout the school year embedding the initiatives and will culminate with an attempt to break the World Record for 'random acts of kindness in a day' for participating Warrington Schools - teenagers making headline news for the right reasons!

Utilising cutting edge research, the 'Brilliant Schools Brighter Futures' is based on 12 years of PhD study into happiness, wellbeing and flourishing lives. AFRITWIN AUCTION OF PROMISES 2018



A ftritwin is a project which has been running in Lymm High School since 2003 linking three very different communities here and in South Africa. We help students to learn about different cultures and open their eyes to the world around them.

Fundraising has previously been undertaken to support a rural township school in the Eastern Cape.

We helped fund a computer suite, a library, a supply of Xhosa/English dictionaries, musical instruments and sports equipment, refurbished classrooms and created a community food garden.

We have also funded mentoring of students and teachers at the school and provided many teaching materials. We are currently raising funds to pay for students to attend a revision camp prior to their final examinations and to support a Soup Kitchen which feeds children with a hot meal during weekends and school holidays.

The Auction of Promises on March 9th is a focal point of our activities this year.
