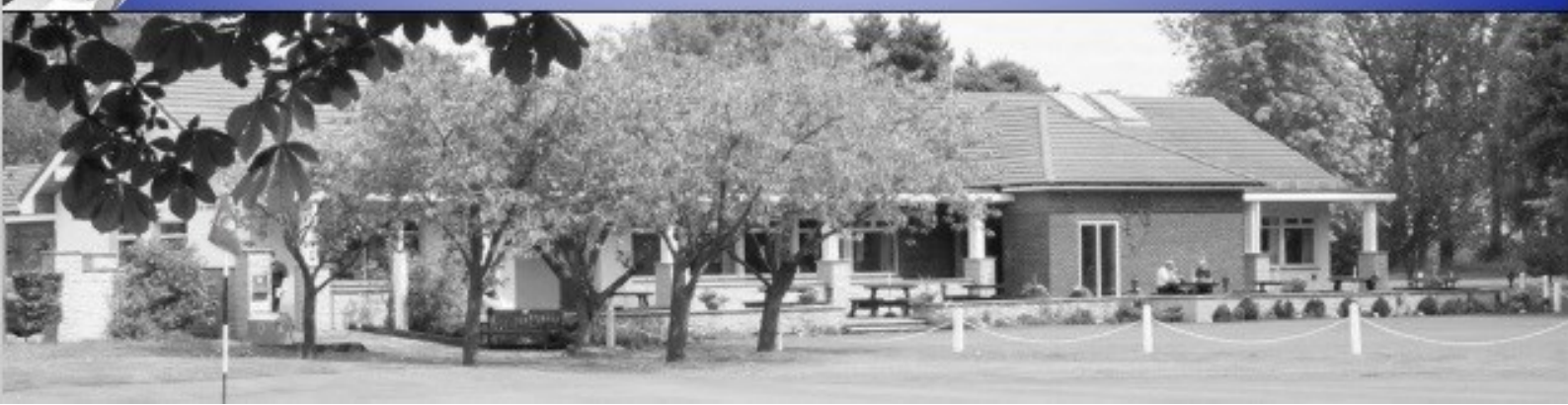

AFRITWIN



Afritwin 2018

Sharing Education Together - This is the motto of the Afritwin charity which has been a part of the extra-curricular activities at Lymm High School since 2003.

In 2001, the school was twinned with Qhasana Senior High School in Mdantsane, the second largest township in South Africa. Since the initial introductions, a twinning partnership has developed between the two schools.

Afritwin has the aim of sharing education together. It is intended that by undertaking to improve the lives of people in a deprived community in South Africa,

those involved will benefit by becoming more aware global citizens whilst, at the same time, benefiting the wider communities in both locations.

Since 2006, a biennial visit of Lymm High staff and students has taken place to the Eastern Cape. During these visits, there has been a strong emphasis on teaching lessons and providing resources to improve the education and facilities in this severely deprived township school.

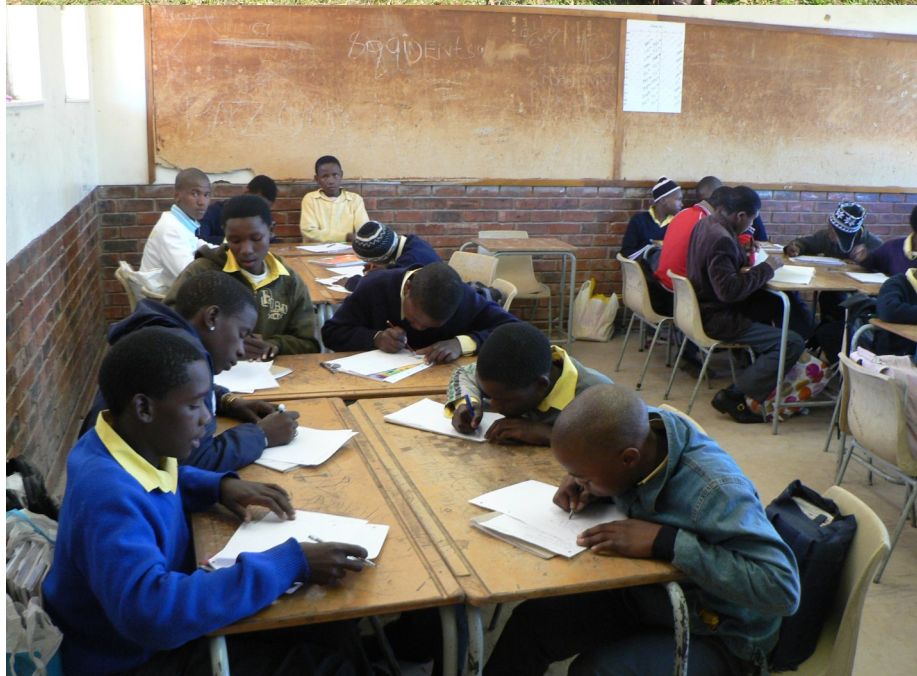
Lymm students have planned and delivered many lessons on crucial aspects of the curriculum; they have led the re-decoration of most of the classrooms in the school and have provided Xhosa-English dictionaries. Other important projects at Qhasana have been the provision of, with the help of Rotary International, a community library and, with the help of Vodafone SA, a computer suite.

During the last visit in August

2016, assistance was given to establish a food garden in the grounds of the school. This was led by an instructor from Trees for Food, a local South African NGO, and will provide food to supplement the government lunch programme for staff and pupils as well as providing an extra food supply for the wider school community.

Afritwin is a true community project. Lymm High School students, staff and families undertake various fundraising activities in and around Lymm and Warrington. Local fundraising such as bag packs at local supermarkets and stalls at Lymm May Queen, Lymm Dickensian and Lymm Transport Day have been supplemented by sponsored walks, clothing collections and bake sales in school.

Afritwin 'elves' are frequently to be seen collecting funds for the Rotary on the Santa Float in December. These funds have been used previously to enhance the partnership by paying for two members of staff and two Qhasana High School pupils to visit the UK and to pay for a particularly deserving student to complete her university course. During each visit the most hard-working and dedicated pupils at Qhasana are rewarded by having their annual tuition fees paid in the form of a scholarship. These only cost £10.00 and have regularly been paid for by families and friends of the project.



The new leadership group has been selected at Lymm High and they are busy planning a year of preparation and fundraising prior to the next South African visit in August 2018.

They are currently planning major improvements to the water supply and toilet facilities with the staff at Qhasana.

The aim is to investigate the possibility of developing a

biogas plant to provide an energy source for the school community and a vastly improved rainwater collection and storage facility as exists at other schools in the area.
