U18 CHESHIRE CHAMPIONS

Lymm High School lifted the Cheshire Schools U18 Cup last Saturday after a thrilling game against Wirral Grammar School.

n an early Christmas present for our school, the 1st XV rugby team became champions for the second year running. With the snow falling, Lymm took on the opposing Wirral

team at the AJ Bell stadium, as curtain raiser to the Sale Sharks European fixture against the Cardiff Blues.

Lymm had already been beaten by Wirral 34-20 in the National Vase a month earlier but after coming off that pitch feeling disappointed and with something to prove, Lymm had trained hard and prepared well for the upcoming fixture. From the kick off, we set the

> Lymm defence with military precision and held strong during the few opportunities that Wirral did have with the ball.

The only blemish to an almost perfect 1st half

defensive display was a late penalty to allow Wirral to take three points and go into the half 7-3 down and gain a little momentum.

After a half time regroup, we knew that Wirral's next 10 minutes were going to be their strongest and we weren't wrong.

started to mount. Wirral started to find some leaks in Lymm's strong, water tight defence of the first half.

Scrambling defence, last gasp tackles and simply working hard kept the Wirral side away from the Lymm try line. However, despite their hard work, our boys couldn't keep the opposing team's kicker from attempting out of range penalties, of which he

managed to kick three, taking the score to 7-9.

Celebrities visit Lymm High to help Pitch In! fundraising campaign!

P remier League referee, Anthony Taylor, and Liverpool and England player Ellie Fletcher visited Lymm High School yesterday to witness a cheque for £10,000 being handed over to support "Pitch In!", the school's bid to build a brand new 3G pitch.

The money was being donated by Lymm Rovers Junior Football Club and the two celebrities were joined by students from Statham Primary School as well as Lymm High's own students, all of whom also play for Lymm Rovers.

Gavin Laidlaw, chairman of Lymm Rovers said:

"Lymm Rovers have worked as a partner with Lymm High School for many years now, continuing to grow as a club and continuing to provide a safe and fun environment to allow children and adults to learn how to play the game.

We share the school's ambition to have first class facilities in place for the students and wider community. It gives us great pleasure to donate £10,000 to the Pitch In! campaign with money that we have set aside for exactly this sort of opportunity"

Gwyn Williams, Headteacher said:

"We are very grateful for the money, which provides a significant boost in our campaign to raise £100,000 this year.

Having Ellie and Anthony here today, alongside children from Statham Primary and representatives from Lymm Rovers, underlines the fact that this is a bid for a facility to support the whole community. I know Anthony is desperate to see more pitches built locally in order to support training of referees and it would also allow us to offer significantly more pitch time in the evenings and weekends to local groups. It's a very exciting project."

Ellie Fletcher, who has been capped three times for England this season, said:

"Having a 3G pitch in the area would be fantastic for local clubs. There's growing evidence that girls in particular love playing on these surfaces and having one in Lymm would provide a massive boost for girls football. I'm delighted to be able to support this campaign."

Lymm High School's Santa Dash raises more than £21,000 for our fundraising campaign.

H undreds of students turned out in Santa Hats for the sponsored Santa Dash which took part on the school grounds on Monday 4th December.

The event saw the entire school community come together to help raise funds for the 'Pitch In!' campaign – a fundraising initiative launched to build a brand new 3G pitch and floodlighting at our school.

A huge well done goes to Mrs Tierney's form group 7TH - winners of our inter-form Santa dash challenge! They managed to raise an amazing £1,136.10 towards the finished total and will be rewarded with lunch served by the senior leadership team in the new year.

Our winning form group were closely followed by 7ML, 7TL and 7DL - with 7ML taking the title of the first form to reach the £500.00 total, earlier in the half term.

We are extremely pleased to announce that we raised a

grand total of £21,178.19 from the event!

Added to our previous total for non-uniform day and the generous contribution from Lymm Rovers last week we have now raised an impressive £35,469.75 towards our 3G Pitch Bid!
