Audiences will be transported to 19th-century France for Lymm High School's winter musical production of "Les Miserables."


he final rehearsals are now well underway and teaching staff from theperforming arts faculties have been working hard with student cast members, to make

"It's a very heavy show for the students," Mrs Richards said.

"Les Misérables" has everything from tragedy to love and romance, she added, teaching them things they might not have considered otherwise.

"But they're doing a really good job handling their characters, understanding what these scenes mean and what these characters are longing for."

Tickets are selling out fast and are on sale at the school shop priced at £8.00 for Adults and £5.00 for concessions.

I t's a really exciting year for the Duke of Edinburgh's Award at Lymm High
School. For the first time in quite a while, we have been able to offer the Gold Award to Year 12 students, in addition to the Bronze and Silver awards which took place in younger year groups last year. The registration is now closed, but well done to the huge numbers of students

that have signed up for one of the three awards.

All students have now been registered with Duke of Edinburgh and we have ordered the packs that enable students to create their eDofE account.

eDofE is the area on the DofE website which allows students to log their evidence and is how students, parents and licensing centres (like us) can

track participation and ultimately sign off awards upon completion. Mark Harnden (Duke of Edinburgh provider) is coming in to school on Tuesday 12th December to log students on.

Each student will receive a specific appointment time for them to come to a particular computer room to meet Mark. Please ensure your child gets their appointment time from

from their form tutor, which will be on the student bulletin w/c 4th December and read out by form tutors. If your child for any reason doesn't receive one by Thursday 7th December, they should visit the school shop to speak to Mrs Hill who will give them the information.

In the meantime, we would strongly recommend that participants choose and start their Skill, Physical and Volunteering sections. It is however essential that participants choose approved activities for each of these three sections as if not, their award cannot be approved.

Organiser of the event Mrs Littler explained; "Meeting the recruiters and asking about their experiences with a company is the best way to learn if the company and the position are a good fit for you," she said. "The Career Fair provides students with an opportunity to make an impact on recruiters whilst also gaining practical knowledge."

n the 10th of October a group of year 10s from the Scholars Programme were given the opportunity to go to Cheshire South College for a North West science event and were invited to a lecture given by an Oxford Material Science Professor. WHAT IS STEM?


STEM brings together Science. Technology. Engineering and Mathematics with an aim of making links between the subjects you study at school and how they are applied in real life.

STEM activities. workshops. competitions and trips offer you great opportunities to discover these subjects in action and hopefully have some fun along the way. Getting involved with STEM is a great way of enriching what you learn in the classroom.

n Thursday 16th November, the maths department took 41 Higher tier students to the GCSE Maths in Action Day at Salford University. The day was designed to inspire the students in their maths studies and introduce them to some applications of Maths outside the classroom that they may be unfamiliar with.

The day started with a talk given by Simon Singh, a renowned scientific and mathematical writer and broadcaster – who spoke about the mathematical secrets of the Simpsons and the link between maths and comedy.

Later in the day, students learnt all about the history of codebreaking and were able to see an original Enigma machine in use. They also learnt about how mathematics could be used to emulate the brain, why they shouldn't always believe everything they read about in the news and some of the ideas behind game theory and how to win at everything! It was an engaging and informative day and the students thoroughly enjoyed their experience.





STEM Competitions

On a Thursday during lunchtime some students are currently taking part in the Shell Bright Ideas Challenge where they have been asked to imagine creative ideas to address problems for the Cities of the Future.

Coming Soon

In January, Manchester University will be starting its annual cryptography competition. Students in Years 9 – 11 will compete in groups of 4 and will be tasked with solving a new code every fortnight leading to a full day of codebreaking and celebration at the University in the summer term.

The codes are released at 4pm every second Monday so participation will require an afterschool commitment. Registration will start in December so interested students should see Mrs Dowdall before the end of November.
