ANTI-BULLYING CONFERENCE

In January, Miss Cradock was delighted to launch the Anti-Bullying Project at Lymm High School.

Working with the Diana Award, this project will be led by students in Year 9 and aims to further promote and develop the anti-bullying work already going on across the school, as well as developing a link programme with the Anti-Bullying Ambassadors at Saddleworth School, Oldham.

On Thursday 9th March, we launched the first stage of this project with 15 students taking part in anti-bullying training led by the Diana Award. This training took place at Matthew Moss High School in Rochdale and saw students working with a number of different schools from across the area. These students are all now Diana Award Anti-Bullying Ambassadors and will work closely with the Diana Award

in the coming months in the setup of their projects.
Students returned from the training buzzing with ideas and have already set the wheels in motion for a launch event in the summer term.

On Friday 17th March we welcomed students from Saddleworth School to take part in a joint Anti-Bullying conference. Saddleworth School has a well-established anti-bullying programme







and so the day kicked off with students leading four short workshops where they shared their ideas and projects with the students from Lymm. It was fantastic to see the students instantly working together and there was a wonderful atmosphere of collaboration in all of the sessions.

The afternoon saw students working collaboratively to identify the key issues they would like to tackle in their schools. It was interesting to share how Lymm High School deals with bullying compared to Saddleworth. This was an amazing opportunity for students to swap and share their ideas. By the end of the day students had come up with 6

collaborative projects which they will start working on immediately, sharing and swapping ideas as they go. In July we will visit Saddleworth School to discuss the successes and challenges of the projects launched so far, and begin planning for the new school year.

for the project. The peer
mentor project has been
running at Saddleworth
School for 3 years but it is

MAKING HER MARK

Lymm High School student Imogen Walsh campaigns to become the next member of Youth Parliament.



he election for the borough's next Member of Youth Parliament (MYP) is well underway, with voting open at local schools, colleges and youth centres until 29th March.

The Lymm High School student, who is currently studying for her GCSE examinations and would like to pursue a career in Politics, is one of the candidates in the running hoping to represent the views of young people across the town.

Run by young people, the Youth Parliament provides opportunities for 11-18 year olds to use their voice in creative ways to bring about social change. Every year the parliament chooses a national campaign and for 2017 they will be campaigning for better transport, the living wage and better opportunities for young people. Mental health was also chosen as a priority campaign for England.

Imogen hopes by being elected, young people in

Warrington can have a say on issues directly affecting them such as public transport, school funding and mental health services and support in schools. She has also called for greater increase of school funding in Warrington.

With a new funding formula set to be introduced from April next year, Warrington's schools face losing almost a quarter of a million pounds a year and the borough to become one of the worstfunded in the country. Commenting on her potential election Imogen said: "The school funding proposals by the government are completely unfair for schools in Warrington. Young people of Warrington work really hard whilst at school and deserve the same opportunities as every other young person in the country."

The Year 10 student said: "I want to give young people a voice to ensure the views of young people in Warrington are listened to by decision makers."

Youngsters aged 11 to 18 can vote at school. It is now time for Warrington to decide. For more information ask at school, college, your local youth centre.

ROWING CLUB

ymm High School has had a long
history of excellence in sport and the
most notable is Rugby, which
translates the presence of Lymm sport
across the country each year. However, the
school harbours talent for lots of different
sports and our young sportsmen and
women continue to have a presence on the
national and international sports scene.

A paradigm example is the rowers. We have in Year 13 the most promising 18 year old rower in the country. Lucy Glover has represented Great Britain for the last 2 years and the signs point to that trend not stopping.

This inspired me to set up LHSRC (Lymm High School Rowing Club). We have about 40 pupils who are 'on the books' and about 10-20 who regularly turn up to the gym at

lunchtime to sample the sport.

The focus is on fitness and technique and is also designed to be a springboard to a future career in rowing. We have a good working relationship with Warrington Rowing Club and Junior coach (and ex pupil) Megan Dumbavand takes time out of her busy University schedule to help deliver quality coaching alongside other rowers who are currently in the sixth form.

So far we have undergone a number of differing activities, had acute technique training on the school rowing machines and have put this into practice with a 500m test. We are planning on running a sponsored row in the summer term and hope that the club will continue to grow along with the presence of rowing at Lymm High School.

BASKETBALL UPDATE

The Year 9 Basketball team competed in the Cheshire School Games after qualifying in 2nd place in the Warrington league. The team played brilliantly and came 3rd place overall, which is a great achievement for all players. The team was led by Andy Williams who ended up highest points scorer in the whole competition. LYMM SPORTS STARS

This week we look at Lymm Sixth Form student James Pritty FA Level 1 qualified coach and school sports technician.

n Year 7 I became involved in the school's football and cricket teams. I was made aware of the expectations at Lymm High School straight away and I soon realised what a privilege it was to represent the school. This continued throughout Year 8 and Year 9, where I was given an unbelievable opportunity to represent the school on a Football tour to Villarreal, Spain. We got the opportunity to train at world class facilities at Villarreal football club coached by elite level coaches within the club. Further to this we played two fixtures against Spanish schools within the area. This whole trip gave me an insight into a new style of football and this trip developed me as a player and a person.

In KS4 I opted for GCSE PE. Throughout this I was given lots of opportunities to explore a variety of different sports developing many skills in each. GCSE PE offers a great balance between practical and theory work which is why it was perfect for a sports enthusiast like me. The theory side enabled me to expand my knowledge in the way the human body works as well as the different components of fitness and methods of training. Due to the fantastic support I was offered throughout the two years I was able to achieve my target grade of an A which made all the hard work completely worth it.

This was the best possible preparation for sixth form where I chose to study an extended national diploma in BTEC Sport, the equivalent of 3 A levels. This course is perfect for anyone that is hoping to obtain a career in sport as it covers all aspects ranging from anatomy and physiology to things such as analysing performance and organising sporting events. As well as the academic side this course has offered me a huge range of opportunities that I have got involved in. I have attended many workshops including leadership days and also disability awareness in sport sessions. In the first year of the course I



was lucky enough to go on a 2 week trip to La Manga sports club in Spain where I assisted UEFA qualified coaches in football sessions involving academy players. This has improved my skills in coaching and has led to me now coaching at Lymm Rovers JFC where I have now completed my FA level 1 in coaching as well as starting a ladies football team. As well as this my BTEC course has allowed me to get involved in the coaching of the Year 7 football team where I assist Mr Mason in both training and match days. This has been very helpful for me as I have been able to understand how the running of a football team works and it has developed me as a coach.

At the start of my second year of the course the PE department gave the BTEC sport students a chance to apply for the role of sports technician in which I was successful. The role mainly consists of assisting with day to day activities including PE practical sessions, responsibility for all setting up and monitoring the good upkeep of the equipment and facilities. With this role comes huge responsibility and I feel I have been able to embrace the concept of operating as part of a team in a working environment and I have performed these tasks alongside my







studies successfully. I am now coming to the end of my course in which I am hoping to achieve 3 D*'s to enable me to study a degree in Sports Business and Coaching at UCFB Etihad Campus.

The BTEC sport course has been the best possible groundwork for this degree as I have studied much of it during the last two years so I can't wait to move on to expand this knowledge further as I have huge aspirations to work in the competitive market that is the sports sector in the future. The PE department have been extremely supportive of me throughout this and have helped me mature and develop as a person preparing me in the best possible way for university life and beyond.
