# LYMM HIGH SCHOOL EARNS A GOLD MARK FOR ARTS

Students have struck gold, thanks to their artistic talents.

A chievements in art, dance, music and drama have earned the school an Artsmark Gold Award – one of the top national honours for schools who show

commitment to providing opportunities across all the arts.

Arts Council England launched the Artsmark awards to encourage schools to increase the range, quantity and type of arts available to students, while also raising the profile of arts education.

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In recognition of the school's extensive participation across the art spectrum and after an audit and inspection from the Arts Council, the school received the Artsmark Gold Award. Receiving the award will allow the school to further enrich their art provision and give them access to an enviable network of leading cultural organisations for the benefit of students and teachers.

Lymm High offers a wealth of opportunities for students to get involved with the arts and has a tradition of staging ambitious productions; including last year's 'Snow Dragons', where students represented the

school at the Dorfman Theatre, London, as a finalist for the prestigious National Connections event; and celebrated shows such as 'Les Miserables'.

In the past twelve months the school's Art and Design Technology department, which has links to the MALL art gallery in London, has seen a number of students go on to study at the prestigious London College of Fashion, and has held a number of notable fashion shows and exhibitions

throughout the year.

Music provision is also extremely strong, with students going on to study at top music schools such as Guildhall, and the school String Quartet crowned winners of the Ensemble Open Class at last year's Bowden Youth Festival. The Artsmark Panel commended the school's sense of ambition and commitment to achieving excellence

> through the arts, as well as offering important space for more personal development and growth. Head of Performing Arts at the school, Rachel Richards, said: "The award is the result of a long and successful journey. We have not only enriched our arts

provision, working with many practitioners but have fostered great pride in sharing our creative practice and our students have relished the opportunity to show off their expertise. "We had to undergo an audit of all the arts in the school and an inspector came to take a look at the way we operate here.

"It was a very useful process which helped us all to see where our strengths are and where we need to move forward."



## BRIGHT FUTURES

Two teams of Lymm High School Year 8 students took part in the Bright Futures competition run by Unilever on Thursday 22nd March.

Their brief was to design a product which encouraged young people to brush their teeth more frequently.

Students were tasked with researching the current market and consumer behaviours. From this, they then had to design a unique product including a suitable formulation and design packaging, along with posters and a video or PowerPoint to use.

As part of the competition our

cohort pitched their ideas to six separate groups of Unilever employees (some of whom were very high ranking). There were five category prizes based on the judges independent scores.

We're extremely pleased to announce that our two teams came joint first in the Consumer award for creating an innovative product. They were judged on their research of the current market, as well as conducting market research to produce claims for their new invention. Both teams

scored full marks with all six sets of judges in this category who remarked on how impressive our teams and their ideas were.

Mrs Cattell, organiser of the visit said, 'Given they are year 8 students the maturity and confidence they displayed was fantastic and they represented their school really well. They all have taken a lot away from this experience and I think they deserve recognition for their hard work and achievement.'

We hope your child is excited about their DofE expeditions. The pre-expedition meeting for students will take place in the Main Hall on Thursday 10th May at 3:15 – 4:30pm (approx.) where students will receive additional paperwork related to the expeditions including pickup and drop-off sites as well as the campsite details. If for any reason you need this information before the meeting, it can be found on the school's website under Enrichment/ Duke of Edinburgh in the Documents section. At this meeting, walking groups and tent groups will be worked out with support from staff so all students are catered for. There is also a kit list on the website please encourage your child to read this and chat to you about what you might need. It is really important that students

have taken the time to read the Expedition Handbook on the website so they are fully prepared and therefore enjoy their expeditions much more.

Students DO NOT need: trangiers or tents – these will be lent to all groups.

### Royal Institution Summer Schools – Now Booking!

This July and August the RI in London is running a number of summer school workshops for young people up the age of 19. RI Summer Schools are a brilliant way for young people to get hands-on with all areas of science, mathematics, engineering and computer science and to meet other like-minded young people. Opportunities include:

Mathematics - Learn from expert mathematicians in our exciting maths-based workshops. Topics include exploring probability and the mathematics behind winning at game shows, discovering the wonders of creating anamorphic art and becoming an expert code breaker and cryptographer. Engineering - Design and build your own robots, get an introduction to the science of rockets and space travel and explore the dynamics of flight using microdrones in our wide range of engineering workshops.

Laboratory science- Join the RI team in the L'Oréal Young Scientist Centre and be a scientist for the day by experiencing a range of lab-based workshops, including making a pin-hole camera, creating your own cosmetics and learning how to control your own LEGO Mars rover.

Computer science - Get to grips with computer science in hands-on computing workshops including making music with a BBC Micro:bit, learning to control and programme a LEGO Mindstorm robot and discovering how to code

# CRYPTOLOGY COMPETION 2018

Since the end of January, three teams of Year 9 and 10 students have been putting their analytical, problem solving and code breaking skills to great use attempting to crack codes as part of Manchester University's annual cryptography competition.

R unning for the past 5 years, the competition involves students solving six codes which are released fortnightly online. Each code is different and they become increasingly difficult over time.

The codes really challenged the students (and some members of the maths department!) and they were very thankful for advice from one of our 6th form students in the later stages.

The competition gives young people a taste of how maths can be used in the real world in a very real and specialised context.

The competition culminated in a Live Crypto Challenge that took place at Manchester University on Wednesday 23rd April. Eight students who were involved in the competition from Day 1 were



selected to attend the event.

The students were welcomed to the Alan Turing Building by the Crypto team – consisting of Lecturers, Researchers and Students of the Manchester University School of Mathematics. It was some of our students first experience of visiting a University campus and they were excited by the opportunity.

In teams of 4, they were tasked with solving three further codes and using these to find a hidden codeword. Teamwork and collaboration were in great evidence and the Lymm teams quickly deciphered each problem and successfully found the missing codeword.

The students were the second and third teams to submit a correct answer but unfortunately on the day, there were no prices for second place!

The second part of the afternoon gave the students the opportunity to find out more about how maths can be applied in real life as they listened to some guest speakers.





The first speaker was Squadron Leader, Paul Kennedy, whose day to day job in the Royal Air Force involves the security of communication and its effective encryption.

The students were then introduced to Ewan Nicholson, a data scientist who currently works for Skyscanner.


His main responsibility at work is to make data useful and extract the key information that will help to inform business decisions.

Ewan spoke about his background and where maths had taken him in his career to date – this included three years travelling the world onboard a ship looking for undersea oil reserves and a further two years working for the BBC as a data scientist where his maths skills were used to help with programme planning and commissioning.

The afternoon culminated with the prize giving for the online competition. This year's overall winners were a team from Stockport Grammar School but our students represented Lymm very well. One team finished in 10th place and all three teams placed within the top 100 from over 1100 teams nationwide.

The students really relished the challenge of the competition and are already excited and looking forward to taking part in the competition again next year!
