





This is the story of the sadly neglected *Book That No One Wanted To Read* - can its destiny change when it finally meets the right reader?


A very funny read with fabulous illustrations. Ayoade's passion for books and writing really shines through.

This book was recommended to me by two people in one week, and they both described it as something very special. I thought I'd give it a try...and I wasn't disappointed. I later discovered that it had been shortlisted for the Blue Peter Book Awards and had won the prestigious Yoto Carnegie Medal for 2022.

This is an unusual story of an eleven year old girl (October) and her father who live 'off grid' in the woods and have very little contact with modern society. October rescues a baby owl and is looking forward to another year of living wild and to raising the chick. However, October's world is turned upside down when her father has a


serious accident and she is forced to move to the city to live with her estranged mother.

This book has strong, relatable characters, despite the unusual story setting. Amongst familiar themes of family and friendship the book also explores the value of nature to personal well-being and to good mental health.



But when Brendan goes missing, Gary needs to track down the girl he now calls Satsuma to get some answers.



# GREAT READS FOR THE WINTER BREAK

With the weather finally getting cold and long evenings ahead, it's the perfect time to settle down with a good book. Here are just a few suggestions for books with a winter theme...





