3G SPORTS PITCH SUCCESS

Students and staff delight as Lymm High School secures funding for 'Pitch In!' 3G Sports Pitch.

Following our fundraising initiative 'Pitch In!' and overwhelming community support, we are absolutely delighted to announce that Lymm High School's bid to secure funding for a new FIFA standard third generation (3G)

sports pitch has been successful!

The Premier League, The FA and Government's Football Foundation have awarded us a grant of over £500,000 to help enable us to install the full-

sized, floodlit pitch that will provide state of the art sports facilities for students during the school day and the community of Lymm and surrounding areas during evenings and weekends.

It's been a long, and sometimes difficult, process, but we are so pleased that we have succeeded in our bid.

Of course, we could not have achieved this without the continued support of parents and wider LHS community.

We set ourselves the very challenging target of raising £100,000 to put towards the project and have very nearly achieved this already.

The current total is just over £90,000 and we still have one or two events and donations to come, which means we are confident we will hit the target by the end of the year.

This is an incredible

achievement in itself and we would like to say a huge thank you to all those parents, students, friends, community organisations and businesses who have supported our fundraising efforts.

Activities have included: summer fairs, the LHS May Ball and numerous other PTA-led events, whole-school Santa dashes and the annual Founders Day activities.

Students have also held and organised a number of events in school, competing within their halls to raise funds, and staff took part in a sponsored climb of Mount Snowdon. We have run a number of raffles

and prize draws and we have had great support in items donated for these from local businesses.

We have also received some very generous donations from our football team, Lymm Rovers and Lymm Piranhas as well as from local people and organisations. Thank you all so very much. The question now on everybody's lips is: "when will we start building?" At the moment, there are still some legal issues to be tidied up and contractors to be booked so we are not quite able to confirm a date but you shall know as soon as we do.

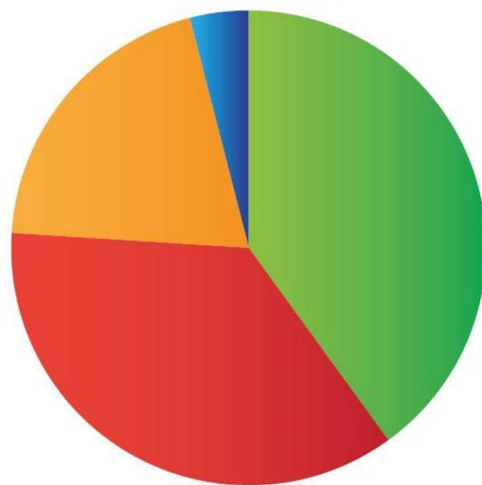

Over 110 enthusiastic parents and friends of the school attended Lymm High School's inaugural Ball at the Hallmark Hotel, Grappenhall on Saturday 18th May.

Guests were entertained by a magician during the welcome fizz and then treated to a sumptuous 3-course meal.

A special Lymm High-themed Heads & Tails quiz kicked off the evening's fundraising,

followed by a raffle and auction later in the evening. DJ Paul Slater then helped round off the evening with a mix of floor-fillers that encouraged dancing until 1am. Prizes were kindly donated by individuals and companies in and around Lymm.

The raffle itself raised over £700 but the auction surpassed all expectations by bringing in well over £3000.

Manchester City's resounding win in the FA Cup that same evening helped the signed shirt to secure a bid of £500.

Other notable big-ticket items included a 5-day stay at La Manga donated by The Wine Kitchen, a 2-night golf package donated by Golf Breaks, and a luxurious evening at Peckforton Castle.

The grand total raised on the night was just over £5000.

The Ball was organised as a new fundraising event with the specific goal of assisting the school to hit its target for the Pitch In fund in order to qualify for potential FA investment into new 3G community pitches in Lymm.

Commenting on the night, Lymm High School Head Teacher Gwyn Williams said:

“The food, decorations and music were all excellent. All in all, I’d say it was a great success – and that’s even before considering that we raised a good amount of money too!”

Lymm High PTA would like to thank the Hallmark Hotel, the numerous local individuals and companies who donated prizes, and all the attendees who helped to make the evening such a memorable success.

It is hoped that this event will be the first of many Lymm High Balls.

During their stay, our French guests enjoyed visits to the

Manchester Science and Industry Museum, John Ryland's library, Beatles Museum in Liverpool, Tatton Park, Dunham Massey and more and were full of praise after each visit despite the weather being very cold. They were thoroughly impressed with the facilities of Lymm High School and particularly enjoyed admiring the sports fields, the leisure

centre and the equipment available to students in the catering, technology and music departments - Lymm is roughly three times the size of their high school.

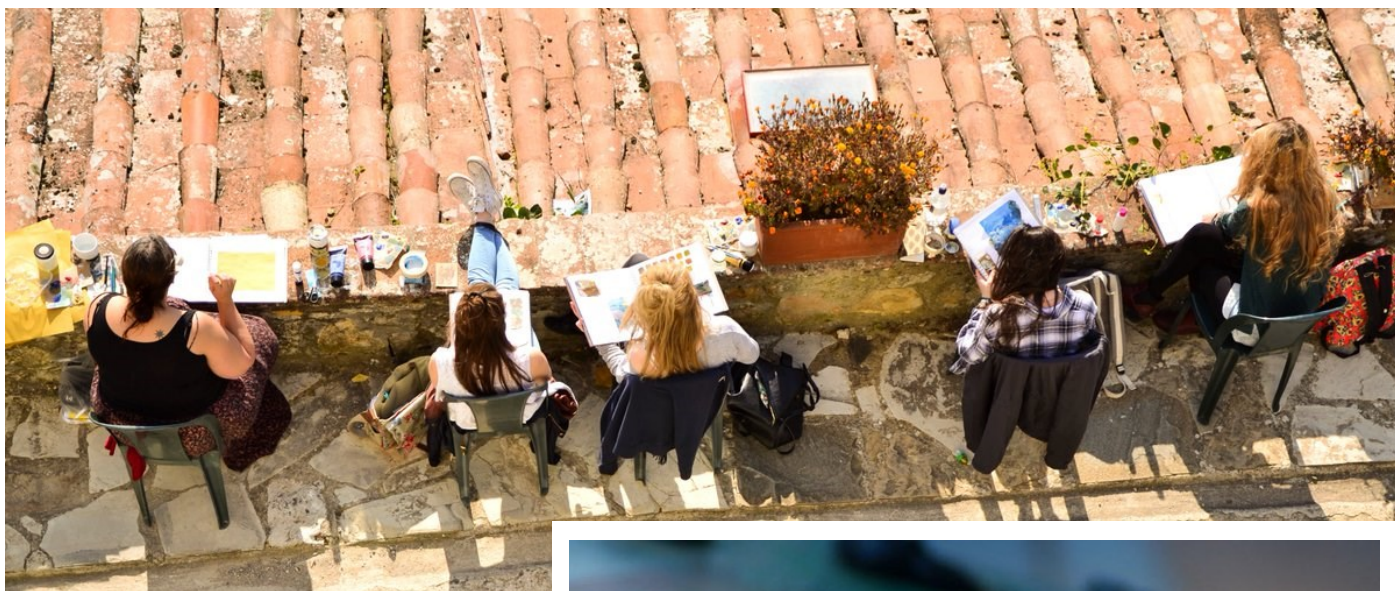

LHS Sixth Form links with Cambridge for HE+

As part of our Gateway Programme, which supports students applying to Oxbridge in the Sixth Form, we are pleased to announce that this year; we joined the HE+ programme.

The HE+ programme is a consortium of schools which link with Cambridge University to support students in developing their super-curricular knowledge and applications for Oxbridge.

On the 2nd May, ten students from Y12 attended the final session of the HE+ programme, featuring 120 students from a variety of

colleges across Warrington and Wigan. It was the culmination of a number of super-curricular subject sessions and a residential visit to Cambridge University.

Students have been working on their own research projects and this week delivered these during a poster presentation evening. They've worked incredibly hard, researching their chosen topic which is centred on the theme of "The Unknown".

The difficult job of judging 120 posters was left to a number of Cambridge University tutors and guest judge Marcus

Orlovsky.

Despite this daunting experience our students were superb in articulating their ideas, research and opinions.

Special congratulations must go to Lewis Hindle who came runner up with his poster "Unknown world of quantum biology and how it could aid the future of Medicine", a fantastic achievement.

Final thanks must be expressed to all students for the time they have given up to undertake this programme and also to the staff who supported with the sessions.



AFRITWIN ANGELS

During our many visits to Qhasana High School and other parts of the Eastern Cape of South Africa, we have made links with African Angels Independent School.

The school was set up, and is run by an Australian woman, Lou Billett. It caters for students from a poor rural area and provides them with a quality education allowing them to progress to some of the best schools in South Africa.

Without the educational opportunities provided by this charity school, the boys and girls from the area would probably be destined, if they were lucky enough to find employment in the first place, to be poorly paid labourers or in domestic service, without

much chance of escaping the local cycle of poverty.

The students (Angels) are able to study in a well-run school with well-qualified and committed teachers and are provided with two meals a day.

The parents pay a small cost towards school transport and the rest is funded by donations from local South African companies, individuals and charitable trusts from around the world.

A former member of staff, Chris Burnett, and his wife, Debbie, have just returned from spending a month working as teachers at the school on a voluntary basis.

Whilst they were there, they were asked if the Afritwin

group at Lymm High School would help them to buy a set of individual white boards for class use and a supply of purple pens, which are used for students to mark their own work (like the green pens at Lymm High).

The funds were duly dispatched and the materials, sourced locally, are now in regular use as you can see in the photographs below.

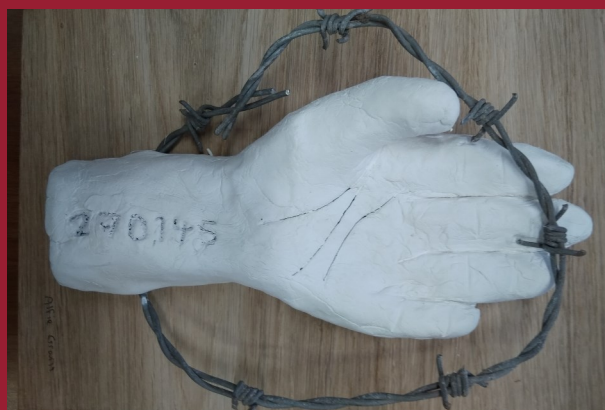
The Afritwin project at school has been running since 2003 and is holding its next fundraising event at Lymm Transport Day on Sunday, 23rd June.

We had four girls' teams, all of whom were incredibly excited to play. Our first game was the Girls' C Team, an incredibly close game, with Lymm C Team shooting and attacking well in the final quarter, ensuring that the game finished 13-7 in our favour.

The B team were up next and, again, with some tough opposition, they had to be at their best. The game finished on a score of 22-4, with Lymm enjoying a much deserved win.

Lymm A team had a fantastic game and demonstrated what a quality team can do when they play their best and thrashed their opposition 43-12, with some excellent play, particularly from Millie Evans who was the Girl of the Match.

Lymm D team had a slow start, but in the third quarter, they started to find their rhythm. Some excellent play from the girls had them in close competition with their opponents, but the lead proved too big to close. The game finished on a respectable seven goals to twenty in the oppositions favour.

At the same time our hockey team headed out to the stunning Hockey Club 'Benalmadena'. The views of the sea and the mountains were absolutely stunning and our girls felt incredibly lucky to play at such a prestigious hockey club. Captained by Clare Davis, the girls played their socks off with Ellie Doherty getting Girl of the Match.

Apart from our fixtures, there was lots of pool time, aqua aerobics, volleyball, tour awards and, of course, our evening talent show. The tour was a fantastic experience for all students involved, and we hope that they have lots of memories to treasure forever.





MANCHESTER MARATHON

A pair of runners from Lymm High School put their best foot forward on Sunday (April 7), as they took part in the Manchester Marathon to raise money for a charity close to their hearts.

The students, both from Lymm High School Sixth Form, pulled on their trainers for the 26-mile course around the city

to raise funds for Amy's nineteen-year-old cousin, Laura, who was sadly diagnosed with terminal brain cancer at the end of last year.

In the lead up to the race, the pair set up a gofundme account seeking sponsorship in an attempt to add to the funds for her treatment and medication.

The two joined around 20,000 runners, who pounded the streets for the Marathon on the day, with the route taking participants to Altrincham and back on the flattest and fastest marathon course in the country.

During the three-mile loop into the city centre, Amy and Jack were able to take in some

of the city's most iconic landmarks including the Manchester Opera House, Spinningfields, Albert Memorial Hall and The Midland Hotel.

The pair completed the course in good time, managing to raise a grand total of £1410, which will go towards Laura's treatment. A fantastic achievement

PLANET SPORT

On the 20th May, Year 10 BTEC Sports Students completed a Leadership Unit of Work which involved planning, leading and reviewing both a sports session and their own leadership skills.

Our Lymm High School cohort were required to lead an activity of their choice that would be appropriate for Year 1 and Year 2 students, but that would also be inclusive to all primary school children.

The group invited local primary schools to the event, organising the structure of the day, job roles and planned activities, as well as choosing what equipment would be suitable for both their session, and the primary school children involved.

Activities organised, planned and delivered by our students varied from Planet Obstacle (students have to work in teams and race around an obstacle course), Planet Parachute, Planet Team (students work as a team in an invasion game) and Planet Football.

The Year 10's were assessed on their organisation, communication, knowledge, enthusiasm, health and safety and their professional conduct during the sessions. The day was a huge success and many of the primary schools commented on how well and professional our year 10 BTEC Sports Students were. They represented the school and themselves fantastically.

STAR OF THE SNOW



Lymm High School rising skiing star, Caitlin Baldwin, has been absolutely flying recently after another notable performance at the British Indoor Skiing Championships.

The school's brightest snow sport prospect came first in her under 14's category, competing against skiers from all over the UK to claim the

title.

Already achieving a number of British, Scottish, English and British Grand Prix titles, as well as the British Primary Schools, British Ski Cross and European Lowland Championships, each race seems to bring a new triumph. This most recent performance, at the Chill Factore, in

Manchester, also ranked her in second place out of all the females across the 11-18 age group.

Caitlin was introduced to skiing just before her 5th birthday and amazingly, managed to achieve every qualification in the French Ski School system, including the Racing Level, by the time she turned eight.

"I loved skiing straightaway and for some reason, found it really easy to turn. I loved going really fast so I always wanted to turn parallel even though my instructors didn't want me to."

However, it wasn't until Caitlin watched British skiing star Chemmy Alcott finish in the top 15 at the Sochi Olympics despite a fractured leg that she decided to race competitively on the Indoor Slopes.

After winning the British Indoor Title and the British Grand Prix series, Caitlin was named as Chill Factore's sponsored athletes list for 2016, receiving coaching from Chemmy Alcott herself.

More recently, Caitlin moved to Ambition Racing, a team based in Leogang, Austria and balances her school work with her skiing.



We are pleased to inform you that the next sports tour will be held in July 2021 touring Cape Town South Africa. Provisional dates are currently Wednesday 21st July returning home Thursday 29th July.

The nine day tour will be based around Cape Town and involve Table Mountain, Robben Island, a Cape Peninsula tour and game drives searching for the 'BIG 5'.

Open to our current Year 9, 10 and 11 students, the tour will officially be launched early in September with the exact information confirmed nearer the time.

The British and Irish Lions will be touring in 2021 and we're sure the excitement in South Africa at this time will be evident in a country that is so enthusiastic about sport.

The cost is yet to be finalised but is estimated at around £2400. This includes full board and all activities planned for the duration of the tour.
