One of the lovely things about the last few weeks has been hearing so many candidates from other schools speaking so highly about what they have seen here and how eager they are to come and work at Lymm High School. There are lots of reasons for this, but one of the biggest is the chance to work with our students; it is no surprise to us because we know how incredible Lymm High students are, but it's always nice to hear that from people from outside of the school as well.
