## Strike action – 5th and 7th July

## **Online safety**

## **Drop Down Day – Thursday 6th July**

On Thursday, students will take part in our final Drop Down Day. Their activities will be as follows:

- Year 7 students will build confidence, teamwork skills and presentation skills designing an ethical business product. Students will compete against others in their form and across the Year for the prize of best product and best presentation. They will finish the day by recapping key First Aid procedures for common injuries. This supplements the CPR training they did in November.
- Year 8 will be visited by the Warrington CELLS speaker team who will talk to students about a variety of topics surrounding crime and the law. These include: Gun, gang and knife crime, the family perspective and joint enterprise, exploitative relationships and prison life, and the emotional aspects of after-prison life (including a visit to a prison cell set up in the playground). Students will be accompanied by form tutors and the Student Services Pastoral Team will also be available for concerned students.
- Year 9 will have two focuses across the day: Citizenship and healthy relationships. We are lucky to have a visit from the School's North West Regional Team for Parliament who will talk about life in government and parliamentary procedures. Year 9 will also have a talk about sexual harassment and what they can do about this if they experience it in school. They will also have a First Aid lesson to help them deal with day-to-day medical scenarios.
