British Values and Citizenship

On **Wednesday 13th September** we will be taking 33 Year 13 students to London for the day for a workshop and tour of Parliament.

The trip will leave by train in the morning and return in the evening after the workshop finishes at 5.10pm. Students will likely need to be picked up from a central train station (details to be confirmed).

Students will explore the role of Government and Parliament in the law-making process during the workshop, run by the Parliamentary education team, which will consider the following: *How does UK Parliament turn an idea into a law?* This highly interactive workshop takes the class through the five stages of a bill, encouraging diverse points of view in an active debate through role play. Focusing on a topic of their choice, students will take the bill through the House of Commons and The House of Lords.

They will examine types of bills, policy creation, public consultation and various methods of scrutiny of legislation by Parliament. Students will feel empowered to influence those decisions that affect their lives to be active citizens in our thriving democracy.


WORK EXPERIENCE


Law Experience

Some of you will remember an ex-Lymm High student called Eva Cope.

I am 17 years old. I have cerebral palsy and I am a full-time powered wheelchair user. I have no verbal speech and use a communication aid to talk.

I am looking for someone to join my small team of personal assistants (PAs) with a professional, fun and supportive attitude, that can work both in and out of the family home. My current PA is amazing but is heading off to University in September.

I am busy and active on weekends; I like to go shopping and do baking. I also like planning events. I love to go Bendrigg Lodge (an outdoor activity centre in the Lake District). I also like days out and visiting my family and friends. Weekends are a mixture of family meals at home, going on trips out, meeting with friends, trips away, making Tik Tok videos and grabbing every opportunity I get to have fun!!

I am planning to go to residential college in September 2024 and need:

- Personal care (includes feeding and going to the bathroom)
- Someone with shared interests to myself
- 100% commitment to role
- Good social skills
- Good problem-solving skills

The required candidate must have a a good sense of humour, a positive attitude, excellent and confident communication skills, and a friendly and caring nature. No previous experience is necessary. The Role pays £10.90 per hour and includes:

- Paid holiday of 5.6 weeks per year (pro rata for hours worked)
- Up to 10 hours available per week. However, the role is flexible, and hours of work will be discussed at interview. Weekend hours preferred. There is scope for additional hours during college holidays.


