

All students start at 8:25am –students go straight to tutor time, this is compulsory.

No holidays during term time.

Medical appointments – inform us in advance, evidence will be requested.

Break time – students to remain on site.

13:15pm finish – only if there is no lesson / SSP, sign out at 6th form student services. This privilege remains under review.

Driving lessons – can only be taken when students have finished for the day, 13:15pm onwards.

- Students have approximately 13 hrs per week of 'non-contact' time. At least 4 of these will be supervised study in the Upper Hex.
- Enrichment Electives.
- Paid work maximum of 8 hours per week, ideally only one day per week (weekend).
- Studies must take priority.



Our mantra (and the secret to our brilliant results)



Each student should work a 40-hour week

Here's the maths

3 subjects x 4 hrs per week = 12 hours (lesson time)

3 subjects x 8 hrs of independent work = 24 hours (use your SSP's)

Tutor Time / Personal development = 2 hours

Enrichment = 2 hours week

Total = 40 hours
