ENRICHMENT

Get involved in Sixth Form life

Engaging in a variety of enrichment activities during Sixth Form is a great way to develop valuable skills and enhance your personal growth. These activities — whether they involve sports, clubs, volunteering or creative projects — offer opportunities to explore your interests, build confidence, and develop leadership, teamwork, and communication skills: all of which are highly valued by universities and employers.

Balancing academics with enrichment activities can also improve your time management and wellbeing, making you a more well-rounded individual who can stand out in future applications. Plus, they provide a break from study, helping you stay motivated and energised!

All Sixth Form students are required to sign up for at least one enrichment activity. Any additional suggestions are always welcome, please share these with student leadership or a member of the Sixth Form team.

















1. Use Active Recall

Try to remember information without looking at notes, then check for accuracy.

Use flashcards, quizzes, or self-test after studying a topic.

Apps like Quizlet can help with spaced repetition and track your progress.

2. Practice Spaced Repetition

Review material at increasing intervals over time, rather than cramming.

Create a revision schedule that spaces out topics over days or weeks. Revisit each topic multiple times rather than in one long session.

3. Mix Up (Interleave) Your Subjects

Study multiple topics or subjects in a single session, rather than focusing on one.

Plan your study sessions to cover different subjects or topics in a rotation, rather than sticking to one subject all day.

4. Engage in Active Learning Techniques (e.g., Teaching or Summarising)

Teach a concept to someone else or summarise complex ideas in your own words.

Try explaining a concept to a friend, family member, or even out loud to yourself. Writing concise summaries, or teaching as if preparing someone for the exam, strengthens mastery.

5. Prioritise Practice Exams and Past Papers

Simulate exam conditions by completing practice questions and past papers.

Complete past papers under timed conditions to simulate the real exam environment. Review your answers critically, and use mark schemes to understand where you can improve.

Combining these techniques with proper rest, nutrition, and time management will optimise your revision and performance in examinations. Do feel free to ask for help with this from your teachers, Tutors or any member of the Sixth Form team, we're all very much here to help support you. Good luck.




