LOWER SCHOOL

Summer Key Stage 3 Exams

Our Year 7, 8 and 9 students will be sitting their summer exams in English, Maths, Science, Humanities and Languages between **9th** and **20th June**. The exams will assess students' knowledge and understanding of the content they have covered this academic year in these subjects. An exam timetable for each year group can be [accessed here](#). Life Programme

Our next extended Life Programme is on **Thursday 5th June**. All year groups have now started their 'Living in the Wider World' unit. This unit looks to explore issues around the world of work, finances, citizenship, and rights and responsibilities within society. This unit will take students up to the end of the year.

Key Stage 3 students will study the following topics:

- **Year 7** have started by looking at finances. They have explored how we utilise money in our everyday lives and what it means within society. They have also explored the importance of having and maintaining a bank account. Next session they will look at making safe financial decisions and how we can spot scams that put us at financial risk.

- **Year 8** have started by looking at personal and British values and exploring ideas around being socially responsible and a positive citizen. They have then looked at the impacts of stereotyping and how it can damage relationships. This will now lead on to exploring ideas around 'Group Think' and how we can challenge this within our friendship groups.
- **Year 9** have been focusing on issues around citizenship and the law. This started with a session on the justice system and the role of juries and judges. They have now had the first part of a session on the voting system and democracy looking at the current parliamentary system and the role we play as citizens in democracy. The next session will conclude this by looking at different voting systems and the impact of excluding groups from democracy, and how we can play a role in promoting positive engagement with democracy.

UPPER SCHOOL

Year 10 Life Programme

Our next extended Life Programme is on **Thursday 5th June**. Due to the mock exams, Year 10 have only just started their Living in the Wider World unit. This first session looked at being a positive citizen and role model in society, and the impact gangs and gang culture can have on communities. The next session will look at the declaration of Human Rights and how it is used to help maintain positive societies, and how we can be socially responsible citizens that respect the rights of others.

Personal Development Update

Our social responsibility theme for this half term is **RESILIENCE**. It is really important to us that our students have the necessary skills to cope positively when faced with challenging and difficult situations which they may face. This is even more crucial for our KS4 and KS5 students who are currently completing examinations across their subjects. Whilst this can feel overwhelming and daunting, we want our students to feel confident that they can overcome any challenge life may bring. Through our assembly schedule and Form time programme, we will be reminding them of how these skills can be developed and applied.
