A reminder of the Teaching English as a Foreign Language (TEFL) letter which was sent out last week.



How the right diet can help revision

There are plenty of revision-friendly superfoods that can help you get the edge on exams, such as fatty fish like tuna and salmon, avocados and walnuts. <u>This article</u> from Harvard University covers the research on these superfoods in more detail.

Kale? You'd better beleaf it

Leafy greens like kale, spinach and broccoli are chock-full of vitamin K, lutein, folate, and beta carotene: all of which are certified brain boosters that keep your grey matter in tip-top condition.

Thank you berry much!

Deeply coloured foods like strawberries and blueberries get their fantastic colours from pigments called flavonoids. These compounds power up your memory, which can only come in handy when you're cramming for your next exam. Dark chocolate, tea and coffee, and even red wine are other top flavonoid sources.

Fancy a cuppa?

Speaking of tea and coffee, in addition to those memory-boosting flavonoids, caffeine can help out when revising, and not just by keeping you awake! Studies have shown participants with higher caffeine consumption to have better cognitive function. Plus, caffeine may have a role to play in helping cement new memories. So if you're looking to learn, a latte might be just what the doctor ordered.

Water good idea!

Proper hydration will improve your mood, your focus and your short-term memory, by flushing out toxins and promoting the creation of new neurons. Your brain is 73%

water, so if you want it to keep it running well, make sure to balance out all that caffeine with plenty of the wet stuff.

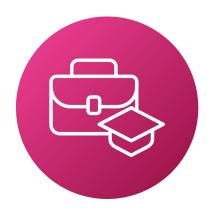
