#### **TAKING PRIDE**

Pride is celebrated in the month of June, as that was the month when the Stonewall riots took place.



The Stonewall riots were important protests that took place in 1969 in the USA, that changed gay rights for a lot of people in the USA and around the world.

Pride is a celebration of people coming together in love and friendship, to show how far LGBT+ rights have come, and how in some places there's still work to be done. In Britain, 3.8% of the UK population (2.6 million) aged 16 years or above identified as lesbian, gay or bisexual in 2023.

At Lymm High School we are allies to the LGBT+ community. We want everyone to feel supported and able to be themselves without fear of discrimination and harassment. If you see evidence of discrimination and harassment at school, please report it. We take this seriously and it matters to us.






