Community safety: Abandoned building in Thelwall

We have received a message from a local resident regarding concerns about an abandoned nursing home on Weaste Lane in Thelwall. The site has become a gathering spot for young people and, unfortunately, has been subject to vandalism and antisocial behaviour. It now poses serious safety risks.

As we approach the summer holidays, we ask parents to speak with their children about the dangers of entering abandoned buildings, the legal consequences of trespassing and vandalism, and the importance of treating local residents with respect. Discounted social broadband tariffs

Home broadband is increasingly essential for supporting students' learning. Households receiving benefits such as Universal Credit could be eligible for discounted social tariffs on home broadband, helping them stay connected at lower costs. If you think you may be eligible, or for more information, we encourage you to visit Ofcom's website. Please also be aware that receiving Universal Credit may also make your child eligible for Free School Meals and therefore also Pupil Premium, so please click here to complete the form and apply.

Life Programme

As part of our Life Programme, KS3 students have been engaging in important PSHE sessions designed to broaden their understanding of key societal issues and prepare them for life beyond the classroom. We'd love for parents and carers to keep these important conversations going at home – discussing the topics together can really help students process and apply what they've learned.

Our next extended Life Programme is on **Thursday 3rd July**.

- Year 7 have now completed their financial education for this academic year, finishing with an engaging session on the relationship between jobs and money. Next week, they will take part in a one-off lesson focused on challenging discrimination, using sport as a lens to explore diversity and inclusion. The session encourages students to reflect on how sport can break down social barriers and promote equality, while linking these ideas to core British Values.
- Year 8 continued to explore the theme of discrimination, this week focusing specifically on gender
 discrimination and how bias can affect our decisions. Building on their previous discussions around
 group think and social responsibility, next week they'll be watching parts of *The School That Tried to*End Racism, using real-life scenarios to deepen their understanding of racial bias and the importance
 of inclusive thinking.
- Year 9 have now completed their political literacy strand of PSHE, having explored democratic
 systems, voting and the boundaries of political opinion versus extremism. Next week, they will take
 part in a one-off session on discrimination, with a focus on the online world and gaming culture.
 Students will explore how to challenge discrimination through acceptance and respect, celebrate
 differences, and contribute to a more inclusive school community.
