The **Emerging Grade** is the grade your child is most likely to achieve by the end of the year based on their current performance and the criteria set for that grade.

Attitude to Learning gives an indication of your child's effort, behaviour and commitment in a particular subject.

Outstandings	Behaviour, effort, homework completion and commitment to learning are exemplary in most or all
Outstanding:	areas, and not less than good in any one area

Good:	Behaviour, effort, homework completion and commitment to learning are good in all areas.
Not meeting expectations:	Behaviour, effort, homework completion and commitment to learning are satisfactory in most areas – there are one or two areas which are causes for concern.
Serious Concern:	Behaviour, effort, homework completion and commitment to learning are less than good in most areas – significant changes in attitude are expected in order to start meeting basic expectations.

Concerns: The columns on the right-hand side relate to any specific concerns that a teacher may have. There will be an 'X' in the column relating to any of those concerns. No 'X's will mean no specific concerns in these areas.

Personal Development: Our personal development programme runs alongside the KS3, KS4 and KS5 curriculum and includes Personal, Social, Health and Economic education (PSHE) and Sex and Relationships Education (SRE) and promotes students' Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural development (SMSC). It also includes our Careers lessons and the Culture and Ethos (or Issues and Debates for KS5) sessions. These sessions are delivered by form tutors and external speakers in a series of lessons over the course of the year. We also use form time, assemblies and drop-down days to cover content and reinforce learning. Our personal development programme is an integral part of students' curriculum at Lymm High School and is also included in programmes of study in every subject. The Attitude to Learning grade and any concerns on this progress report reflect students' engagement and participation in these activities.

Leadership Ladder: This is a leadership awards scheme that reflects the values and ethos of Lymm High School: exercising social responsibility, developing leadership skills and providing cultural experiences to help broaden students' horizons. We expect all students to get involved with the Leadership Ladder and document evidence of activities they are involved with both inside and outside of school. This allows students to become active members of our school community, and gain recognition and rewards for their achievements. Last year, we were delighted that more than 75% of KS3 students have now achieved either their Bronze, Silver or Gold awards, with many more having started one. All students should aim to complete at least one Leadership Ladder award per academic year. Please see links to the enrichment timetables below for examples of opportunities:
