SUMMER CELEBRATION






You've applied to join Lymm Sixth Form, so now is a great time to start thinking ahead – not just to September, but also to what comes after Sixth Form. Whether you're already considering university, apprenticeships or employment, take the time to think about these things:

Things to Do This Summer

⇒ **Recheck your Sixth Form offer and course**

Entry requirements

Before GCSE Results Day in August, make sure you've double-checked the entry requirements for each of your chosen subjects. These are outlined in your original offer letter and are important when confirming your place on Results Day.

⇒ **Not sure about your subject choices?**

If you're still feeling uncertain about you're A' Level or BTEC subject choices don't worry – you're not alone! The Sixth Form team will be on hand on GCSE Results Day to help guide you. We're happy to help you think through your strengths, ambitions and career aspirations before final subject decisions are made on Results Day.

⇒ **Think about University applications**

It might seem a long way off, but universities often look for relevant A' Level subjects, super-curricular experiences (e.g., reading around your subject, online lectures, work experience). Do your research to make sure you've selected the right courses for your chosen career.

⇒ **Think about how to prepare for Independent Study Time**
