Concern regarding unsafe driving and parking near school

We have received a number of complaints regarding dangerous driving and inconsiderate parking in the vicinity of the school. In particular, we have been made aware that Longbutt Lane is very busy, with students walking this way to school and parents choosing this road to drop their children off. We have had reports of cars blocking driveways, speeding, and parking on the curb blocking access to the footpath. All of which poses a significant risk to the safety of our students, as well as other pedestrians and drivers in the area. Please can we ask that you drop your child off a little further away from school to avoid congestion in this area. We understand that drop-off and pick-up times can be stressful and that everyone is eager to get their children to school on time, but the safety of our students is our top priority.

Year 8 Water Safety Assembly

On **Tuesday 7th October**, Cheshire Fire and Rescue Service will deliver a special Water Safety Assembly for all Year 8 students. During this session, students will learn how to stay safe around rivers, lakes and other open water; understand the dangers of cold-water shock and fast-moving currents; and find out what to do if they, or someone else, gets into difficulty. This important presentation will help students develop the knowledge and confidence to stay safe in and around water.
