LOWER SCHOOL

Life Programme

On **Wednesday 10th December**, KS3 students will be engaging with these key topics as part of the *Life Programme* during Form time:

- **Year 7: Prejudice**
Students will explore what prejudice looks like in everyday life, with a particular focus on ableism and transphobia. They will examine how stereotypes form, how discrimination impacts individuals, and how the Equality Act 2010 protects people with protected characteristics. The aim is to build empathy, challenge misconceptions and promote respectful behaviour.
- **Year 8: Healthy relationships**
Students will look at the qualities that make relationships positive and respectful, including trust, communication and boundaries. They will also discuss signs of unhealthy or controlling behaviour, how to seek support, and how to maintain friendships and relationships that are safe and supportive.
- **Year 9: The dangers of ketamine and so-called 'legal highs'**
Students will learn about the short- and long-term risks associated with ketamine use, including physical and psychological harm. They will also explore why 'legal highs' is a misleading term, the laws that govern these substances, and how to make safe, informed decisions.

We encourage you to explore these topics with your child at home, as open discussion can greatly enrich their learning.
