# LIFE PROGRAMME

## Year 12

## Year 13

### ***Preparation for mock interviews***

Year 13 will complete an interview preparation lesson designed to help students build confidence and develop strong communication skills for upcoming university, apprenticeship or job interviews.

This session will focus on the STAR method (Situation, Task, Action, Result) – a proven technique for structuring responses to competency-based questions clearly and effectively. Students will learn how to reflect on their experiences, highlight their achievements, and present themselves professionally under interview conditions.

## STUDY LEAVE – IMPORTANT PLEASE READ

- Students will have study leave on **Monday 17th, Tuesday 18th and Wednesday 19th November**.
- Lessons will continue as normal on **Friday 14th** and **Thursday 20th November**, unless a student has an exam on those days, in which case they may take the morning for study leave if they have an exam in the afternoon. If they have an exam in the morning on either of these days, they must attend any timetabled lessons after their exam has finished.
- Please note that **lessons for all BTEC courses** and for students studying **Photography, Art and 3D Design** will continue as normal throughout this period. Students should attend all of their lessons for these subjects unless they clash with an exam.



## Empowering students to study Medicine & Dentistry

According to the Medical Schools Council (MSC) and the Dental Schools Council (DSC), those who wish to pursue a career in healthcare often cite the opportunity to help others as a main reason, sometimes stemming from personal experiences of receiving help from a doctor or dentist in the past. As such, the MDC and DSC now wish to empower future students.

Students need to be aware of the following aspects when making their application choices:

- Information about the university (such as location, accommodation and student life).
- Information about the course and how it's taught (e.g., split between lectures and labs).
- Entry requirements (these can change yearly).
- Admissions test requirements, such as the UCAT.



It's important for students to visit Open Days so they can experience the university in-person, meet staff and current students, and ask any questions they have. Some universities offer virtual Open Days, as well as healthcare-specific open days and events. You can check the [Studying Healthcare Events page](#) for a listing. Some universities offer financial support for students facing barriers to travel.

The MSC and DSC publish entry requirements for courses in the UK, including non-academic requirements and information on key topics such as resit policies and contextual admissions.
