

Equity conferences

Thursday 27th November

We are pleased to share the exciting, compulsory upcoming opportunities for our students next Thursday during Periods 3 and 4.



Beyond Equality will deliver workshops to our male students, focusing on positive relationships, challenging harmful stereotypes, and encouraging empathy and leadership. Students will be given the chance to unpick what it means to be a boy in the current cultural climate.

At the same time, we will be hosting an Empowerment Conference for girls, featuring inspiring speakers and interactive sessions on confidence building, wellbeing and future aspirations.

Both events aim to support students' personal development and equip them with the skills and knowledge they need to thrive.



LIFE PROGRAMME

Year 13

Year 13 students will have the valuable opportunity to take part in mock interviews. These are designed to help you build confidence and prepare for future university, apprenticeship or job applications. These practice interviews will simulate real interview settings, giving you the chance to refine your communication skills, receive personalised feedback, and gain insight into what interviewers are looking for. This is a fantastic chance to strengthen your preparation for life after Sixth Form. Half the year group will have an interview on Wednesday, the other half will have their interviews on **Wednesday 10th December**. Schedules for this will be sent via email. In Life Programme when you are not having your interview you will have a session about lowering the voting age. The session encourages students to consider arguments both for and against allowing 16 and 17-year-olds to vote, helping them to think critically about democratic participation, civic responsibility and how political decisions impact young people. By engaging with a range of viewpoints and evaluating evidence, students are developing informed perspectives on an important issue that continues to shape national discussion. Should it pass through government 16 and 17 year olds will be able to vote

in the May 2029 election.

Year 12

Students will be developing essential life skills through a practical and engaging workshop on personal finance. The session will cover key topics such as budgeting, understanding payslips and the differences between renting and mortgages — equipping students with the knowledge they need to make informed financial decisions as they move towards greater independence. By exploring real-world scenarios and everyday financial responsibilities, we aim to support students in building confidence and readiness for life beyond school.






