LOWER SCHOOL

Key Stage 3 (KS3) exams

KS3 exams will take place the week commencing **Monday 19th January 2026** and are in English, Maths and Science for students in Year 7, 8 and 9. Please support your child with their revision according to the content

Year 9 Choices

Please save the date for the Year 9 Choices Evening on **Thursday 29th January 2026**. This will take place in school and further information will be communicated in the New Year.

Life Programme

On **Tuesday 13th January 2026**, KS3 students will be engaging with these key topics as part of the *Life Programme* during Form time:

- Year 7: Stereotypes and homophobia students will explore how stereotypes develop, how they influence the way we see others, and why challenging them is essential for creating an inclusive community. They will look at the roots and impact of homophobia, understand the importance of respecting different sexual orientations, and consider how language and behaviour can either harm or support others. The session aims to build empathy, challenge bias and understand the law.
- Year 8: The dangers and laws on sexting students will learn about the legal implications of creating, requesting or sharing explicit images, with clear guidance on why sexting poses serious risks for young people. They will explore issues of consent, pressure, online permanence and emotional wellbeing, as well as the laws that protect minors. Students will also consider how to seek help if they or someone they know feels unsafe or is affected by image sharing.
- Year 9: Eating disorders students will examine different types of eating disorders and how these
 conditions can affect physical and emotional health. They will discuss the pressures that can
 contribute to disordered eating such as social media, body image expectations and stress and
 learn how to recognise signs that someone may be struggling. The focus is on promoting body
 positivity, understanding support pathways and encouraging early help-seeking.

We encourage parents and carers to discuss these themes with your child at home, as open conversation can deepen understanding and support their wellbeing.

Life Programme

On **Tuesday 13th January 2026**, KS4 students will be engaging with these key topics as part of the *Life Programme* during Form time:

- Year 10: Mental health students will explore a range of mental health topics, including how to
 recognise signs of stress, anxiety and low mood. They will consider healthy coping strategies, the
 importance of talking openly about mental wellbeing, and where to access support both inside and
 outside school. The aim is to build resilience, reduce stigma and empower students to look after
 themselves and others.
- Year 11: Perseverance and being yourself students will reflect on the importance of persistence, self-belief and authenticity, particularly as they approach exams and life beyond school. They will explore strategies for staying motivated, managing setbacks and celebrating individuality. This session encourages confidence, positive self-identity and a growth mindset.
