CHRISTMAS DINNER



LIFE PROGRAMME

Our next Life Programme session takes place on Wednesday 10th December.

Year 12

Year 12 students will take part in a media literacy session designed to help them understand how information is created, shared and interpreted in today's digital world. They will explore how to identify reliable sources, recognise bias and misinformation, and think critically about the content they encounter online – particularly on social media. The session also encourages students to reflect on how media influences opinions, emotions and decision-making. This is an important part of preparing young people to navigate an increasingly complex information landscape with confidence, independence and safety.

Year 13

Half of our year group will continue with their mock interviews. These are a valuable opportunity to build confidence and prepare for future university, apprenticeship or job applications. The practice interviews simulate real interview settings, giving the chance to refine communication skills, receive personalised feedback,

and gain insight into what interviewers are looking for.

The other half of the year group will be in Form having a session about lowering the voting age. This session encourages students to consider arguments both for and against allowing 16- and 17-year-olds to vote, helping them to think critically about democratic participation, civic responsibility, and how political decisions impact young people. By engaging with a range of viewpoints and evaluating evidence, students are developing informed perspectives on an important issue that continues to shape national discussion. Should it pass through government 16 and 17 year olds will be able to vote in the May 2029 election.




SIXTH FORM DRIVERS






