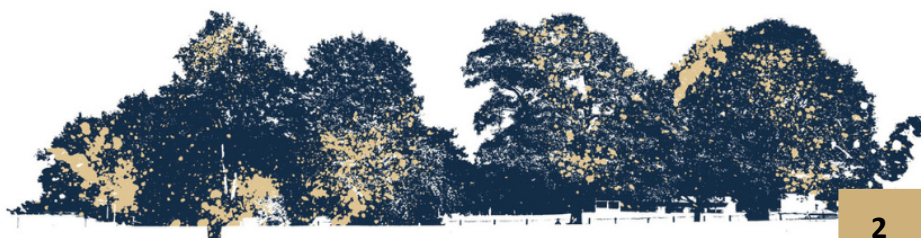
Y13 PROFESSIONAL AND APPRENTICESHIP PATHWAYS

Year 13 Professional and Apprenticeship Pathways

Future Pathways Support sessions will take place every Tuesday morning. These sessions are designed specifically to help students prepare effectively for employment, apprenticeships or other training routes. All students who have not applied to UCAS will attend.



The programme includes:

- Post-18 employment and apprenticeship routes.
- What employers look for in applications and assessment centres.
- The importance of a strong CV, professional behaviour, and confidence in recruitment settings.
- Building a professional identity.
- Mastering the job application and interview process.
- Understanding workplace skills and expectations.
- Individual support with applications, interview preparation and assessment activities.

These sessions ensure that students receive both structured guidance and personalised support as they make informed decisions and progress towards their chosen post-18 destination.

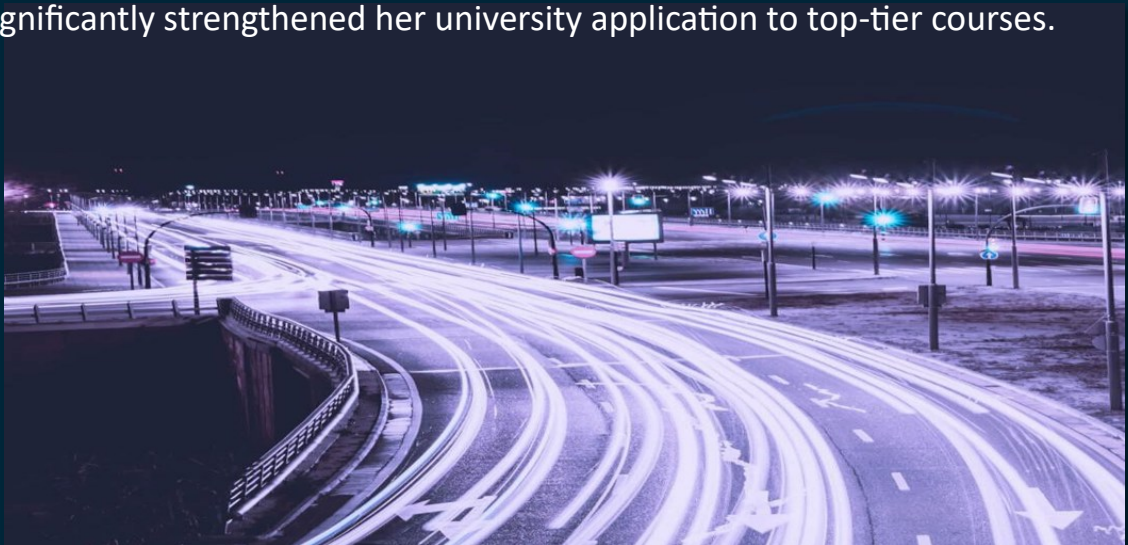
CONGRATULATIONS

Exam Etiquette

To ensure exams run smoothly, students must arrive **15 minutes before** the scheduled start time:

- Students must attend their timetabled lessons unless they clash with an exam.
- If a student has an exam in the afternoon, they are permitted to miss timetabled lessons in the morning in order to prepare and revise.
- Where a morning lesson is missed due to an afternoon exam, students must check with their subject teacher in advance and follow instructions regarding catch-up work, homework or independent study.

Academic Support Plan Students – Alternative Arrangements

Students who are currently on Academic Support Plans will not be on study leave and must attend Sixth Form throughout this period. These students:

- Must attend school every day from 8.25am to 3.10pm.
- Must sign in and out at the Sixth Form desk each period.
- Will study in their allocated study rooms with a member of staff.
- Do not need to attend Form Time or other lessons (as these will not be running) unless they study one of the coursework subjects listed above.

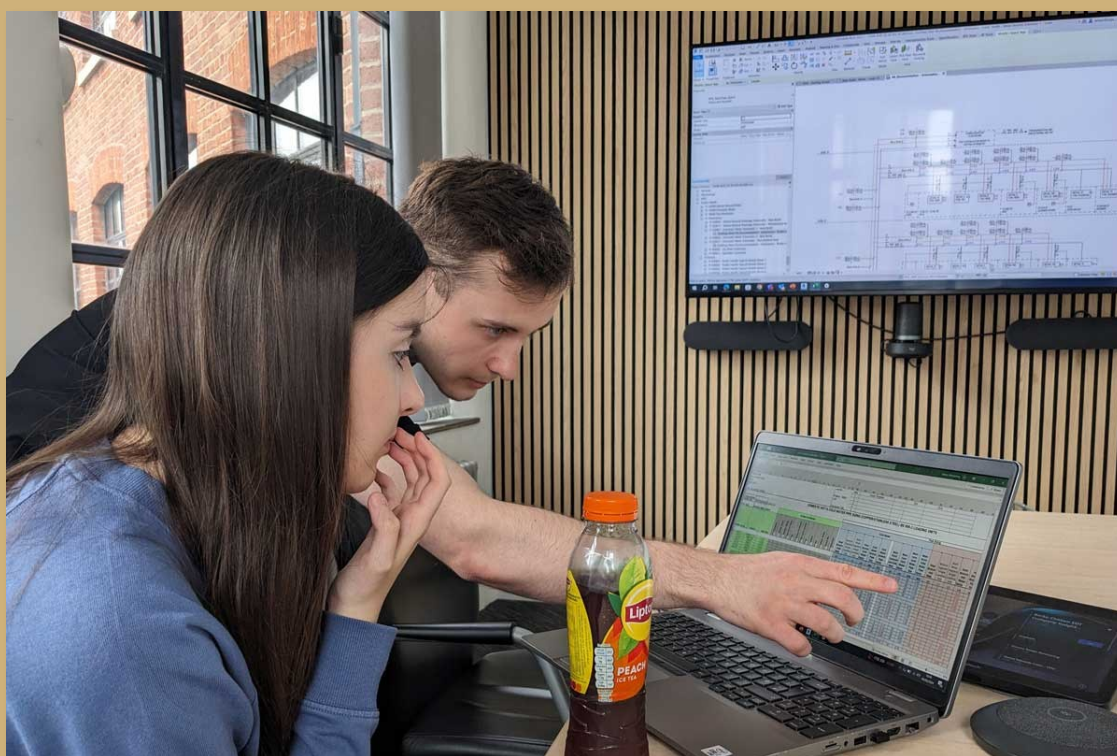
STEM Summer Residentials
