Cycle safety

Please can parents and carers remind students that they need to be especially careful when riding bikes to and from school on dark mornings and dim afternoons. Light-coloured or fluorescent clothing can help other road users to see cyclists in daylight and poor light, while reflective clothing and/or accessories can increase

visibility in the dark. In addition, cyclists must always use lights when visibility is poor, and wear a correctly fitted cycle helmet that is securely fastened and conforms to current regulations.

Free School Meals

The Government is expanding the Free School Meal (FSM) system from September 2026, meaning that all households receiving Universal Credit will qualify for FSMs but parents and carers will still need to apply for FSMs to Warrington Borough Council.
