Life Programme

As part of our ongoing Extended Life Programme, KS3 students will take part in the following sessions on **Thursday 7th May**. These sessions are designed to support students' personal development, wellbeing and future planning through age-appropriate topics.

- **Year 7:** Students will take part in a session on Healthy Diets, which includes guidance on making balanced food choices and understanding the risks associated with energy drinks.
- **Year 8:** This session will focus on Cannabis, Alcohol and Vaping, helping students understand the health risks, legal implications, and social pressures related to these substances.
- **Year 9:** Students will receive feedback from their recent assessment, addressing common misconceptions. In there is sufficient time, the session will also introduce the topic of vaping, building awareness around its risks. This topic will continue in the next session.

In addition, all year groups will take part in a short life programme session highlighting the dangers of exploring abandoned buildings, with an emphasis on personal safety and risk awareness.
